

MINUTES OF OCTOBER 10TH, 1934.

An adjourned regular meeting of the Council of the Town of San Anselmo was held on October 10th, 1934, at 8 o'clock P.M.

Present: Councilmen Dempsey, Scotford, Dos Reis, Linch and Fusselman.

Absent: None.  
Mayor Fusselman presiding.

The minutes of the meeting of October 9th were approved as read.

A communication signed Mrs. C. T. Weaver calling Council's attention to the dangerous condition of steps leading from Redwood Road to Olive Ave. was read and referred to the Superintendent of Streets, with the view to ascertaining whether or not they were dedicated to and accepted by the Town as a public thoroughfare before taking action on the repair of same, and the Clerk was instructed to so notify the writer.

A communication from the Marin County Federation of Women's Clubs, protesting the cutting of trees along ~~Sequoia Drive~~ <sup>R.H. AVE</sup>, was read and placed on file.

ORDINANCE NO. 228: (AMENDING ZONING ORDINANCE):

An ordinance amending Ordinance No. 190, entitled "An Ordinance regulating and establishing the location of Trades, Industries, Businesses and Dwellings in the Town of San Anselmo, etc." was presented for first reading and was read.

Upon motion of Councilman Dos Reis, the owner of a certain parcel of land affected by the final passage of the aforementioned Ordinance, was granted a temporary permit to erect a structure thereon, the plan or sketch thereof having already been submitted to the Council for approval. Motion was seconded by Councilman Linch and carried by the following vote:

Ayes: Councilmen Dos Reis, Linch and Fusselman.  
Noes: Councilmen Dempsey and Scotford.

R.R. CROSSING DRAINAGE OPPOSITE SEQUOIA PARK ENTRANCE:

Upon motion of Councilman Linch, the Clerk was instructed to communicate with Mr. O'Keefe with a copy to Mr. Neff, Supt. N.W.P.R.R.Co., requesting that they confer with the Superintendent of Streets in reference to faulty drainage at the first Railroad crossing, east of Sir Francis Drake Blvd., opposite the entrance to Sequoia Park. Motion was seconded by Councilman Scotford and carried by the following vote:

Ayes: Councilmen Dempsey, Scotford, Dos Reis, Linch and Fusselman.  
Noes: None.

Upon motion of Councilman Scotford, the Attorney was requested to draw up a contract between the Town of San Anselmo and E. A. Forde for the

improvement of portions of Red Hill Ave. and Sir Francis Drake Blvd., in accordance with the plans and specifications for the same prepared by the Engineer, said contract to be drawn in a manner satisfactory to and in accordance with the requirements of the Department of Public Works, Division of Highways, State of California. Motion was seconded by Councilman Linch and carried by the following vote:

Ayes: Councilmen Dempsey, Scotford, Dos Reis, Linch and Fusselman.  
Noes: None.

Upon motion of Councilman Linch, the Clerk was requested to return the certified checks accompanying the bids of the unsuccessful bidders. Motion was seconded by Councilman Dos Reis and carried by the following vote:

Ayes: Councilmen Dempsey, Scotford, Dos Reis, Linch and Fusselman  
Noes: None.

Upon motion of Councilman Linch, the project engineer, in the matter of the improvement of portions of Red Hill Ave. and Sir Francis Drake Blvd., was authorized to request the Department of Public Works, Division of Highways, State of California, to make available for the project the sum of \$5475.00, as noted in their letter of September 19th, 1934, instead of the sum of \$5000.00, as set up in the Memorandum of Agreement between the Town of San Anselmo and the said Department of Public Works, Division of Highways, State of California. Motion was seconded by Councilman Dempsey and carried by the following vote:

Ayes: Councilmen Dempsey, Scotford, Dos Reis, Linch and Fusselman.  
Noes: None.

Upon motion of Councilman Scotford, the Town was authorized to apply for a Federal Radio Control Construction Permit. Motion was seconded by Councilman Dempsey and carried by the following vote:

Ayes: Councilmen Dempsey, Scotford, Dos Reis, Linch and Fusselman.  
Noes: None.

It was agreed that the entire Council would view the location of certain cypress trees growing in the sidewalk area along Sequoia Drive, with the view to determining whether or not said trees constitute a real menace and should be removed in the event a plan to move the fence line of Col. Jordan's fails.

Upon motion of Councilman Dos Reis, the City Health Officer was instructed to inspect the cesspool on Col. Jordan's property and to report his findings to the Council. Motion was seconded by Councilman Dempsey and carried by the following vote:

Ayes: Councilmen Dempsey, Scotford, Dos Reis, Linch and Fusselman.  
Noes: None.

There being no further business, the meeting was adjourned to Thursday, October 18, 1934 at 8 o'clock P.M.
