MINUTES OF NOVEMBER 13TH, 1934.

A regular meeting of the Council of the Town of San Anselmo was held on Tuesday, November 13th, 1934, at 8 o'clock P.M.

Present: Councilmen Dempsey, Scotford, Dos Reis, Linch and Fusselman.
Absent: None.
Mayor Fusselman presiding.

The minutes of the meeting of October 18th were read and approved.

The request of Mrs. M.J. Lynch that certain drain pipes at the foot of Bungalow Ave. required attention before the heavy rains was referred to the Street Committee for investigation.

The written report of Dr. Hensler stating that an inspection of the sanitary conditions of the property of Col. John A. Jordan had been made and further stated that unless he should receive a justified complaint from those residing in the vicinity he would recommend no change at the present time.

Upon motion of Councilman Scotford the offer of \$15.00 by the San Anselmo Firemen's Club for the purchase of the old fire bell was accepted and the matter was ordered handled through the Purchasing Agent.

The written request of the Proprietor of the City Limit Garage, on Sir Francis Drake Blvd., Fairfax, for assistance in rocking the area in the vicinity of his gas pumps was denied and the Clerk was instructed to so advise the writer.

A petition signed by Chas. Lavaroni and others in the vicinity to have Lots 5 and 6, Yolanda Park, withdrawn from the Residential Zone and rezoned as Business property was read and referred to the Clerk for checking.

A communication from the Owner of the property in question urging Council to take such action in the matter was read and placed on file.

A written request that his name be withdrawn from the petition above referred to was received and placed on file.

The request of A.L. Blake, Larkspur, for a refund of moneys expended for a building permit issued to him in 1925 or 1926 and which to date has never been used, was denied, as was his request for a \$3.50 refund in connection with a charge now appearing on his 1934-35 tax statement for services rendered by the Fire Department in burning weeds or grass from the parking strip fronting his property, the Chairman of the Fire Committee stating that it was a just bill for such service.

Before taking action in the matter of appointing an inspector for the annual tree trimming programe, as requested in a letter from the Dist. Manager of the P.G.& E. Co., dated November 6th, it was decided that the ^{Supt.} Supt. of Streets confer with the Cmpany and endeavor to have said work done under the supervision of an expert tree man.

Upon motion of Councilman Scotford, permission was granted the Little Burner Co. to install the tank and necessary heating equipment in the home of Harry G. Russell, 114 Alder Ave., providing such installation meets the requirements of the Fire Marshal and that a 10 inch terra cotta flue will be used. Motion was seconded by Councilman Dos Reis and carried by the following vote:
