MINUTES OF DECEMBER 12TH, 1934.

An adjourned regular meeting of the Council of the Town of San Anselmo was held on Wednesday, December 12th, 1934, at the hour of 8 o'clock P.M.

The minutes of the meetings of November 13th and December 11th, 1934, were read and approved.

Upon motion of Councilman Scotford, the P.G. & E. Co. was granted permission to do their annual tree trimming, it being understood that such work will be done under the supervision or by the Davie Tree Co.

Motion was seconded by Councilman Dempsey and carried by the following vote:

A communication signed Mrs. E.B. Gray, requesting Council to replace several trees on her property at #14 Oak Ave. which, she claims, were destroyed by the Fire Dept. while burning grass in her neighborhood several years ago, was read. The Chairman of the Fire Committee and the Superintendent

of Streets, having informed the Council of certain facts in this matter, the Clerk was instructed to inform the writer that the Town is under no obligations to re-plant the trees in question.

Upon motion of Councilman Dos Reis, permission was granted A.A. Costa to remove an old tree between the curb and sidewalk in front of his property in Lincoln Park, also Mr. Musser was permitted to remove an elm tree in front of his place, and if agreeable to the owner, the one in front of the property of Mrs. Donnelly on San Rafael Ave., both of which are causing serious damage to the street and sidewalk, it being understood that replacement of the trees will be made by petitioners. Motion was seconded by Councilman Linch and carried by the following vote:

The Superintendent of Streets reported that the foot bridge opposite the Town Hall was in need of certain repairs, also that the Hawthorn trees in Morningside Court should be trimmed at this time.

Permission was granted the Pacific Tel. & Tel. Co. to proceed in the usual manner with its annual tree trimming programe.

The Superintendent of Streets was authorized to place "red reflectors" on several trees, and a telephone or lightpole in the vicinity of El Centro Market on Red Hill Ave.

Councilman Dos Reis introduced the following resolution and moved

"RESOLVED by the City Council of the City of San Anselmo that the League of California Municipalities be engaged to perform the following services:

To maintain a legislative bureau at Sacramento during the 1935 session of the California State Legislature and to prepare and forward to the City of San Anselmo regular bulletins and reports on the status of legislation affecting said City and to undertake and carry forward activity in support of a program for an allocation of a greater percentage of the 3 cent state gasoline tax to the city to be used for the construction, reconstruction and maintenance of streets of said city other than state highway routes and to secure complete State Highway Department financing of all state highway routes within said city, and
