BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the statement of the League of California Municipalities in the sum of \$45.00 in payment of the services hereby engaged be and the same is hereby approved and the proper officers of the city are hereby ordered and instructed to cause a warrant to be drawn in favor of the League of California Municipalities in the sum of \$45.00 as payment in full for said services."
