

MINUTES OF APRIL 26, 1935.

A special meeting of the Council of the Town of San Anselmo was called on April 26, 1935 at 8:30 P.M. for the purpose of adopting a Resolution applying for SERA works projects and such other matters to come before the Council for consideration.

Present: Councilmen Dempsey, Scotford, Dos Reis, Linch and Fusselman.
Absent: None.
Councilman Dempsey was appointed Clerk Pro Tem.

Councilman Scotford introduced the following Resolution and moved its adoption:

"WHEREAS, The City Council is a legally constituted body duly authorized to act in the behalf of the Town of San Anselmo, and
WHEREAS, the Emergency Relief Administration, State of California, has made available relief labor to be used on work projects of public benefit, social and economic value, and
WHEREAS, the Town of San Anselmo is in need of such work but has not the funds regularly budgeted for said work, therefore
BE IT RESOLVED that application be, and is hereby made to the Emergency Relief Administration, State of California, for work relief projects as per the attached estimates and specifications.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that William D. Fusselman be, and is hereby authorized to sign all applications for Works Relief Projects submitted by this body to the Emergency Relief Administration, State of California.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that any and all works relief projects approved by the Emergency Relief Administration, State of California shall be conducted in full accordance with all rules and regulations governing the work to be undertaken."

Resolution was seconded by Councilman Dempsey and carried by the following vote:

A regular meeting of the Council of the Town of San Anselmo was held on Tuesday, May 14th, 1935, at the hour of 8 o'clock P.M.

The minutes of the meeting of April 9th, also of a Special Meeting held on April 26th were approved as read.

COMMUNICATIONS:

A communication signed Feodor Muhr, concerning a claim for damages sustained by Julius Cerf in running his vehicle into the crossing traffic signal near the Lansdale School was read and the Clerk was instructed to notify the writer to forward all particulars to the Asst. City Attorney.

Legislative Bulletin No. 9 received from the League of California Municipalities, concerning proposed legislation authorizing the State to tax automobiles on the basis of weight and value and retaining the revenue therefrom, was read and the Mayor was authorized to forward a telegram to both Senator Reindollar and Assemblyman Scudder protesting such action.

A communication from the State Compensation Insurance Fund congratulating the Town on minimizing accident costs, during the past year, and enclosing a check in the amount of \$144.12 covering payment of an earned dividend, resulting therefrom, was read and placed on file.

The Clerk was directed to send a letter of thanks and to inform Mrs. Donnelly, Chairman of Publicity and Program of Marin County Historical Society, that if possible, a representative of San Anselmo will be present at the meeting of said organization to be held at the Marin Golf & Country Club, on May 23, at 6 P.M.

Upon motion of Councilman Dempsey, the Mayor was authorized to file a written protest with the County Assessor in re "charging Municipalities one cent per assessment" for printing the City Assessment Rolls. Motion was seconded by Councilman Scotford and carried by the following vote:
