

MINUTES OF SEPTEMBER 10, 1935.

A regular meeting of the Council was held on Tuesday, September 10th 1935, at the hour of 8 o'clock P.M.

Present: Councilmen Dempsey, Scotford, Dos Reis, Linch and Fusselman.
Absent: None.
Mayor Fusselman presiding.

The minutes of the previous meeting were approved as read.

A communication from the Marin Co. Milk Co., commending the Police Department for its co-operation in halting milk thievery was read and placed on file. Similar action was taken on the communication received from the City Health Officer.

Upon motion of Councilman Linch, seconded by Councilman Scotford, and carrying unanimously, Councilman Dos Reis was granted a leave of absence for a period of thirty days.

Upon motion duly made and unanimously carried, the Chairman of the City Council was authorized to enter into a contract with the Oakland Towel Company to handle the laundry of the Fire Department.

A communication from the Austin Western Road Machinery Co., concerning purchase of a grader, was read and referred to the City Attorney.

Upon motion of Councilman Dos Reis, the Marin Oil & Burner Co. was granted permission to install a 500 gallon fuel tank on the premises at 1556 San Anselmo Ave. Said installation to meet requirements of the Board of Fire Underwriters. Motion was seconded by Councilman Linch and carried by the following vote:

Ayes: Councilmen Dos Reis, Linch and Fusselman.
Noes: Councilmen Dempsey and Scotford.

Upon motion duly made, seconded and unanimously carrying, the following Resolution was passed and adopted and a copy thereof was forwarded to the Railroad Commission:

"WHEREAS, it is reasonably estimated that the GOLDEN GATE BRIDGE, now under construction, will be completed and ready for traffic during the year 1937, and

WHEREAS, this Council feels that some system of Motor Bus Transportation over said bridge, operating between San Francisco and Marin County points, will soon be a real necessity because of an expected increase in population,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that this Council does hereby voice its approval of such a method of transportation for both passenger and freight and hereby recommends to the Railroad Commission of the State of California, that applications for certificates of Public Convenience and Necessity, to operate such a system of transportation, be given careful consideration.

Mrs. Bell asked that a large tree growing in the sidewalk area, opposite her property on Madrone Ave., be removed and after some discussion the matter was referred to the Street and Parks and Housing Committees for investigation.

Upon motion of Councilman Dos Reis, seconded by Councilman Linch, and carrying unanimously, two tires and tubes, if necessary, were ordered purchased for the automobile of the Building Inspector.

Upon motion of Councilman Linch, seconded by Councilman Dos Reis, and passing unanimously, all purchases must receive the approval of the Council in session, except in cases of emergency, when a majority membership of the Council shall be hereby authorized to make such expenditures between meetings of the Council, such authorization to be made in writing.

There being no further business, the meeting was adjourned to Tuesday, September 24th, 1935, at 8 o'clock P.M.
