An adjourned regular meeting of the Council was held on Tuesday, October 15th, 1935, at 8 o'clock P.M.

The minutes of the meetings of September 10th, 24th and October 8th were read and approved.

The communication of Clara L. Quigley, #72 Butterfield Road, concerning the acceptance of a certain private roadway leading from Butterfield Road to her property was read and referred to the City Attorney for further consideration.

The request of Mrs. Littlefield for certain street repairs was referred to the Street Committee and Superintendent of Streets with power to act.

Upon motion of Councilman Dos Reis, the P.G. & E. Co. was authorized to employ Roger F. Sohner to supervise its tree trimming program in San Anselmo. Motion was seconded by Councilman Linch and carried unanimously.

The communications from the Railroad Commission and the Marin Municipal Water District, acknowledging receipt of letters from the Clerk were read and placed on file.

The report of the Building Inspector for the month of September was read and placed on file.

Bids for gasoline and oil, from the following Companies, were received:

Upon motion of Councilman Linch, seconded by Councilman Scotford, and passing unanimously, the Mayor was authorized to enter into a contract with the Shell and Associated Oil Companies for the purchase of gasoline and oil for town consumption for the ensuing year, at prices quoted.

It was agreed that the Engineer and members of the Council will view a portion of Upper Scenic Ave. and determine the extent of work to be done before accepting bids therefor.

Upon motion of Councilman Scotford, seconded by Councilman Dempsey, and passing unanimously, the first reading of an Ordinance entitled, "An Ordinance regulating the installation of oil burning equipment and for the storage and use of oil fuels in connection therewith" was limited to the reading of the title only. Thereafter, upon motion duly made, seconded and unanimously passing, the above mentioned Ordinance was so read.
