An adjourned regular meeting of the Council was held on Tuesday, October 15th, 1935, at 8 o'clock P.M.

Present: Councilmen Dempsey, Scotford, Dos Reis, Linch and Fusselman.
Absent: None.
Mayor Fusselman presiding.

The minutes of the meetings of September 10th, 24th and October 8th were read and approved.

The communication of Clara L. Quigley, #72 Butterfield Road, concerning the acceptance of a certain private roadway leading from Butterfield Road to her property was read and referred to the City Attorney for further consideration.

The request of Mrs. Littlefield for certain street repairs was referred to the Street Committee and Superintendent of Streets with power to act.

Upon motion of Councilman Dos Reis, the P.G. & E. Co. was authorized to employ Roger F. Sohner to supervise its tree trimming program in San Anselmo. Motion was seconded by Councilman Linch and carried unanimously.

The communications from the Railroad Commission and the Marin Municipal Water District, acknowledging receipt of letters from the Clerk were read and placed on file.

The report of the Building Inspector for the month of September was read and placed on file.

Bids for gasoline and oil, from the following Companies, were received:

Shell Oil Co.

Associated Oil Co.

Mohawk Oil Co.

Upon motion of Councilman Linch, seconded by Councilman Scotford, and passing unanimously, the Mayor was authorized to enter into a contract with the Shell and Associated Oil Companies for the purchase of gasoline and oil for town consumption for the ensuing year, at prices quoted.

It was agreed that the Engineer and members of the Council will view a portion of Upper Scenic Ave. and determine the extent of work to be done before accepting bids therefor.

Upon motion of Councilman Scotford, seconded by Councilman Dempsey, and passing unanimously, the first reading of an Ordinance entitled, "An Ordinance regulating the installation of oil burning equipment and for the storage and use of oil fuels in connection therewith" was limited to the reading of the title only. Thereafter, upon motion duly made, seconded and unanimously passing, the above mentioned Ordinance was so read.

Upon motion of Councilman Dempsey, seconded by Councilman Linch, and passing unanimously, the same method was pursued in connection with the passage of a Resolution of Intention of closing a certain street in the Rosenthal Tract.

Upon motion of Councilman Dempsey, seconded by Councilman Linch, a "Resolution declaring the intention of the Council of the Town of San Anselmo to close up in whole and abandon that certain unnamed street or lane running through, over and across that certain parcel or parcels of property in the Town of San Anselmo, Marin Co., State of Calif., hereinafter particularly described and belonging to Alvin Gerlack and Sybil G. Gerlack, his wife", was passed and adopted by a unanimous vote of the Council.

The President of the local Chamber of Commerce addressed the Council, outlining details of a "Navy Day" celebration to be held in San Anselmo on Monday, the 28th day of October, and petitioned the Council for financial aid.

Upon motion of Councilman Scotford, a donation of \$100. was voted, such amount to be charged to advertising. Motion was seconded by Councilman Dempsey and carried by the following vote:

Ayes: Councilmen Dempsey, Scotford, Dos Reis, Linch and Fusselman.
Noes: None.

The Engineer read a letter from the State Department of Public Works, concerning delay of highway improvement due to shortage of funds in the gasoline tax allotment.

Miss Snell addressed the Council with the view to having a certain parcel of land rezoned permitting her to serve meals in a home which she is negotiating to purchase. After some discussion and a straw ballot, the Council went on record as approving her plan.

Upon motion of Councilman Dempsey, Warrant No. 1395, also Warrants Nos. 1539 to 1585, incl., and also Warrant No. 1588, were ordered paid. Motion was seconded by Councilman Scotford and carried by the following vote:

Upon motion of Councilman Scotford, seconded by Councilman Linch, and passing unanimously, the Parks and Housing Committee was authorized to give Mr. Tombolini permission to trim the trees fronting his property on Tamalpais Ave.

Upon motion of Councilman Dempsey, seconded by Councilman Linch, and passing unanimously, the Council was authorized to sell three cubic feet of Cal. rock to Mr. Wood.

Upon motion duly made, seconded and unanimously passing, the Purchasing Agent was authorized to make certain expenditures for the Street Fire and Police Departments, as set forth in his written request presented to the Council.

There being no further business, the meeting was adjourned to Wednesday, November 12th, 1935, at 8 o'clock P.M.

MINUTES OF NOVEMBER 12TH, 1935.

A regular meeting of the Council of the Town of San Anselmo was held on Tuesday, November 12th, 1935, at the hour of 8 o'clock P.M.

Present: Councilmen Dempsey, Scotford, Dos Reis and Linch.
Absent: Councilman Fusselman.

Upon motion of Councilman Linch, Councilman Scotford was appointed Mayor Pro-Tem. Motion was seconded by Councilman Dempsey and carried unanimously.

The minutes of the previous meeting were ordered changed to read that after motion duly made, seconded and unanimously passing, the first reading of Ordinance No. 233 was limited to the reading of the title thereof only; thereafter, said minutes were approved as read.

A letter of thanks for certain street repairs fronting Mrs. Littlefield's property on Sequoia Drive was received and placed on file.

A communication from Mr. McSheehy ~~was read~~, calling attention of Council to faulty drainage, causing a flooded condition of his property on Ross Ave. opposite Jones St. was read and the matter was referred to the Engineer for investigation with instructions to report back to the Council at its meeting, November 19th.

A communication was received from the Marin Planning Survey Committee, inviting Council to attend a meeting of said organization to be held in the Court House at San Rafael on Tuesday, November 12th, 1935, The Clerk was instructed to notify the writer that a meeting of the City Council of San Anselmo was held on the same evening and therefore such request could not be complied with.

A request from the League of California Municipalities for a special contribution in connection with the League's hearings on public utility valuations before the State Board of Equalization, was read and the
