MINUTES OF FEBRUARY 18th, 1936.

An adjourned regular meeting of the Council of the Town of San Anselmo was held on Tuesday, February 18, 1936, at 8 o'clock P.M.

Present: Councilmen Dempsey, Scotford, Dos Reis, Linch and Fusselman.
Absent: None.
Mayor Fusselman presiding.

The minutes of the meeting of February 11, 1936 were approved as read.

A communication signed Jas. B. Aitken, calling Council's attention to a badly needed street repair was read.

On motion of Councilman Linch, seconded by Councilman Dempsey, and unanimously passing, the Superintendent of Streets was instructed to repair the shoulder of Sir Francis Drake Blvd. for a distance of several hundred feet opposite the Standard and Union Gasoline Stations.

The Chief of Police was instructed to co-operate with the School Department in abating the nuisance of dogs running at large on school grounds and streets adjacent thereto.

The Clerk was instructed to answer the communication of L. S. Bush, Chief Engineer of the Board of Underwriters of the Pacific.

On motion of Councilman Dos Reis, seconded by Councilman Linch, and unanimously passing, the Building Inspector was instructed to notify Mr. Beebe that unless the suggested change is made in the studding of that certain dwelling he is erecting in Lincoln Park, a warrant for his arrest will be sworn to at once.

ORDINANCE NO. 234: "An Ordinance calling a Special Election in the Town of San Anselmo for the purpose of submitting to the electors of said Town the proposition of incurring a bonded indebtedness of said Town for the acquisition of the following Municipal Improvements of said Town, to-wit: The incurring by said Town of San Anselmo of a bonded indebtedness by the issuance and sale of bonds to be known as 'Municipal Investment Bonds', etc." was presented for first reading.

Upon motion of Councilman Scotford, seconded by Councilman Linch, and by the unanimous vote of the Council, the reading of said Ordinance was limited to reading of the title only.

ORDINANCE NO. 233: "An Ordinance relating to the care and expenditure of moneys received from the State of California under the provisions of Article 5, Chapter 1, Division 1, of the Streets and Highways Code" was presented for final reading and was passed and adopted by the following vote: Ayes: Councilmen Dempsey, Scotford, Dos Reis, Linch and Fusselman Noes: None.

The Ordinance was then signed by the Mayor and numbered 233.

The Mayor asked that the Council attend a committee meeting on Thursday, February 27th, 1936, for the further discussion on the contemplated bond issue.

On motion of Councilman Scotford, seconded by Councilman Dempsey, and unanimously passing, the Purchasing Agent was authorized to have the generator on the Town Truck repaired and also to purchase some paint.
