The Mayor asked that the Council attend a committee meeting on Thursday, February 27th, 1936, for the further discussion on the contemplated bond issue.

On motion of Councilman Scotford, seconded by Councilman Dempsey, and unanimously passing, the Purchasing Agent was authorized to have the generator on the Town Truck repaired and also to purchase some paint.

MINUTES OF MARCH 10, 1936.

A regular meeting of the Council of the Town of San Anselmo was held on Tuesday, March 10, 1936, at 8 o'clock P.M.

Present: Councilmen Dempsey, Scotford, Dos Reis, Linch and Fusselman.

Absent: None.

Mayor Fusselman presiding.

The minutes of the previous meeting were approved as read.

On motion of Councilman Scotford, Sam Knoles was granted permission to install a 110 gallon gasoline storage tank under his building at 14 Greenfield Ave., providing there is no conflict with the Board of Fire Underwriters' requirements. Motion was seconded by Councilman Dos Reis and carried by the following vote:

Ayes: Councilmen Scotford, Dos Reis, Linch and Fusselman.

Noes: None.

Councilman Dempsey not voting.

The Superintendent of Streets was instructed to notify Mrs. Percy, Bank Street, that since her petition deals with a complaint in the sidewalk area, the matter of repairs should be borne by the property owner.

Several letters complaining of roaming dogs, etc., were received

from various residents of the Town and placed on file. Also several verbal protests on the subject were heard by the Council, and after considerable discussion, it was agreed that further consideration be given the matter before drafting a new dog ordinance.

The matter of temporary road repair work in Sequoia Park was referred to the Superintendent of Streets for consideration.

A petition signed Kernan Robson requesting Council's aid in building a retaining wall along Raymond Ave. between Kemp Ave. and Crescent Road, was read and petitioner's agent was advised that the matter was solely that of the property owners since the contemplated work is within the sidewalk area.

No action was taken on the bid of James B. Aitken for servicing and washing police cars.

On motion of Councilman Scotford, seconded by Councilman Dos Reis, and unanimously passing, the Purchasing Agent was authorized to make certain expenditures for the Police, Fire and Street Departments, and the Tax Collector, as set forth in his written request of even date.

On motion of Councilman Dempsey, seconded by Councilman Linch, E. A. Forde was authorized to build a 4 ft. shoulder on the east side of Sir Francis Drake Blvd. from the bridge to Perry's line, a distance of several hundred feet, at a cost of \$60.00. Motion carried by the following vote:

Ayes: Councilmen Dempsey, Scotford, Dos Reis, Linch and Fusselman.
Noes: None.

On motion of Councilman Linch, seconded by Councilman Scotford, and unanimously passing, the Mayor was authorized to enter into a contract with E. A. Forde for scarifying and grading of the unpaved roads and streets within the corporate limits of the Town.

WARRANTS: On motion of Councilman Dempsey, Warrants Nos. 1823 to 1873, inclusive, were ordered paid. Motion was seconded by Councilman Dos Reis and carried by the following vote:

RESOLUTION NO. 108: Councilman Scotford introduced the following Resolution and moved its adoption:

"RESOLVED by the City Council of the Town of San Anselmo that a General Municipal Election be held in said Town of San Anselmo on Tuesday, the 14th day of April, 1936. for the purpose of electing the following officers:

1. Two Councilmen for the full term.
2. City Clerk for the full term.
3. City Treasurer for the full term.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that said General Municipal Election be consolidated with a Special Election to be held on the same day: that the

following proposition will be submitted at said election: The proposition of incurring a bonded indebtedness of said Town for the acquisition of the following Municipal Improvement of said Town, to-wit: The incurring by said Town of San Anselmo of a bonded indebtedness by the issuance and sale of bonds to be known as "Municipal Investment Bonds", the proceeds from the sale of which shall be used for the purchase of Municipal Securities or evidences of debt either of said Town of San Anselmo or of Boroughs or Districts therein; including Municipal Bonds of said Town, bonds of Boroughs or Districts therein or any Bonds or Liens arising out of the construction or acquiring of public improvements by local assessment within said municipality;

There will be three Voting Precincts for the purpose of holding said election, which precincts shall be a consolidation of the regular election precincts for holding State and County elections, and shall be as follows:

Consolidated Voting Precinct "A", comprising State and County Precincts Nos. 46, 47, 48 and 49, and the polling place thereof shall be at the Yolansdale School House.

Consolidated Voting Precinct "B", comprising State and County Precincts Nos. 50, 51, 52 and 58, and the polling place thereof shall be Schrader's Garage on Saunders Avenue at Yolanda Station.

Consolidated Voting Precinct "C", comprising State and County Precincts Nos. 53, 54, 55, 56, 57 and the polling place thereof shall be the Town Hall.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Election Officers for said election shall receive as compensation for their services the sum of Seven Dollars and Fifty Cents (\$7.50) each, and they shall be as follows:

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that upon said day of election, the polls shall be open between the hours of 6:00 o'clock A. M. and 8:00 o'clock P.M. and the City Clerk is hereby authorized to cause notice of said election to be published as required by law."

ORDINANCE NO. 235: (Re-zoning) An Ordinance providing for the re-zoning of Lots 152 to 156, inclusive, as per map of Ross Valley Park, Sub. 2, was presented for first reading and was read.

The Report of the Building Inspector for the month of February, 1936, was received and placed on file.
