On motion of Councilman Dempsey, seconded by Councilman Dos Reis, Warrants Nos. 1874 to 1950, inclusive, were ordered paid.

Thereafter the Council proceeded to canvass the ballot of the Municipal Election, held on April 14th, and Councilman Dos Reis introduced the following Resolution and moved its adoption:

"RESOLUTION NO. 109.
DECLARING CANVASS OF RETURNS, AND RESULTS OF GENERAL
MUNICIPAL ELECTION HELD APRIL 14, 1936."

WHEREAS, a General Municipal Election, consolidated with a Special Election at which the hereinafter mentioned proposition was submitted to the electors of the Town of San Anselmo, was held in said Town of San Anselmo, on Tuesday, the 14th day of April, 1936, as required by law and the Ordinance calling said Special Election, and

WHEREAS, it appears that notice of said election was held and legally given, that voting precincts were properly established, that election officers were appointed, and election supplies furnished, and that in all respects said election was held and conducted and the votes cast thereat received and canvassed, and the returns thereof made and declared in the time, form and manner as required by the general laws of the State of California governing elections in cities of the fifth and sixth class, and

WHEREAS, the Council of said Town met at the Council Chambers on Monday, the 20th day of April, 1936, to canvass the returns of said election and install the newly elected officers, as a result of which the Council finds that the number of votes cast, the names of the persons voted for, and other matters required by law, to be as hereinafter stated; NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED as follows:

That the said Municipal Election was held and conducted in the Town of San Anselmo on Tuesday, the 14th day of April, 1936, in the time, form and manner as required by law; that there were three voting precincts established for the purpose of holding said election, consisting of a consolidation of the regular election precincts for holding State and County elections, as follows:

- Consolidated Voting Precinct "A", comprising State and County Precincts Nos. 46, 47, 48 & 49.
- Consolidated Voting Precinct "B" comprising State and County Precincts Nos. 50, 51, 52 and 58.
- Consolidated Voting Precinct "C", comprising State and County Precincts Nos. 53, 54, 55, 56, 57.

That the whole number of votes cast in said Town was 1149; that the names of the persons voted for, the offices to be filled at said election, together with the whole number of votes which they received in the entire Town is as follows:

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that at said General Municipal Election, William D. Fusselman, and Earl S. White, were elected to the office of Councilman of the Town of San Anselmo for the full term of four years; that F. D. Burrows was elected to the office of Clerk and Assessor of said Town for the full term of four years; that L. B. Crane was elected to the office of Treasurer of said Town for the full term of four years.

WHEREAS, the City Council of the Town of San Anselmo by Ordinance No. 234 duly called and ordered held in said Town of San Anselmo an election on the 14th day of April, 1936, for the purpose of submitting to the qualified voters and electors thereof the following proposition, to wit:

Proposition: Shall the Town of San Anselmo incur a Bonded indebtedness in the principal sum of \$90,000.00, in accordance with the provisions of the ordinance calling the election at which this proposition is submitted for the object and purpose of acquiring the following municipal improvement of said Town, to wit: The incurring by said Town of San Anselmo of a bonded indebtedness by the issuance and sale of bonds to be known as "Municipal Investment Bonds", the proceeds from the sale of which shall be used for the purchase of Municipal Securities or evidence of debt either of said Town of San Anselmo, or of boroughs or districts therein; including municipal bonds of said Town, bonds of boroughs or districts therein or any bonds or liens arising out of the construction or acquiring of public improvements by local assessment within said municipality.

AND WHEREAS, said ordinance calling and ordering said election was duly published as required by law and by said ordinance as appears from the affidavit of F. E. HOWARD on file in the office of the City Clerk of the Town of San Anselmo;

AND WHEREAS by said ordinance calling said election it was provided that said election should be, and the same was, consolidated with the general municipal election held on the same day in said Town; and whereas said election was so held as hereinabove stated in all respects as required by law, and as aforesaid, said City Council met, on this day, to wit Monday, the 20th day of April, 1936, at the hour of eight o'clock P.M. at its usual place of meeting for the additional purpose of canvassing the returns of said election as required by law, in connection with the above mentioned proposition voted upon at said election, the result of said canvass is found to be as hereinafter stated and set forth: IT IS HEREBY RESOLVED, DETERMINED AND DECLARED by the City Council of the Town of San Anselmo, as follows:

1. That the proposition voted upon at said election was as follows: PROPOSITION:

Shall the Town of San Anselmo incur a bonded indebtedness in the principal sum of \$90,000.00, in accordance with the provisions of the ordinance calling the election at which this proposition is submitted for the object and purpose of acquiring the following municipal improvement of said Town, to wit: The incurring by said Town of San Anselmo of a bonded indebtedness by the issuance and sale of bonds to be known as "Municipal Investment Bonds", the proceeds from the sale of which shall be used for the purchase of Municipal Securities or evidence of debt either of said Town of San Anselmo or of Boroughs or districts therein; including municipal bonds of said Town, bonds of boroughs or districts therein or any bonds or liens arising out of the construction or acquiring of public improvements by local assessment within said municipality.

That the number of votes cast at said election so consolidated in favor of and against said proposition was as follows, to wit:

That one "Absentee" vote was cast against said proposition; in precinct "C". That 121 persons casting votes at said election ~~as consolidated with said General Municipal Election~~ did not vote either for or against said proposition; that more than two-thirds of all of the votes cast at said election were in favor of said proposition and authorized the incurring of a bonded debt for the purpose set forth in said proposition, and that said proposition carried; and that the City Clerk of the Town of San Anselmo be, and he is hereby, instructed to enter this resolution on the minutes of this Council as a statement of the result of said election.

The Clerk shall enter on the records of the Council a statement

of the result of the said election, showing (1) the whole number of votes cast in said Town; (2) the names of the persons voted for, and the proposition voted upon, (3) the office to fill which each person was voted for, (4) the number of votes given at each precinct to each of such persons, and for and against said proposition, (5) the number of votes given in the Town to each of said persons, and for and against said proposition voted upon.

The Clerk shall thereupon make and deliver to each of the persons elected a certificate of election signed by him and fully authenticated; he shall also impose the Constitutional Oath of Office and have them subscribed thereto, whereupon they shall be inducted into the office to which they have been elected.

On motion of Councilman Linch, seconded by Councilman White, and unanimously passing, permission was granted the Striped Bas Carnival to string one of its banners across Tunstead Ave., from the Cheda to the American Trust Buildings.

Mr. Shearer's communication concerning disorderly conduct and hilarity of patrons of Mr. Aitken's Ice Cream Parlor, and petitioning Council to help keep the peace and quiet of the neighborhood, was read and after some discussion, on motion of Councilman Dempsey, seconded by Councilman Linch, and unanimously passing, the Chief of Police was instructed to check the matter carefully and if such actions continue, to warn the guilty parties that the nuisance must be abated.

on motion of Councilman White, seconded by Councilman Dempsey, a warrant in the sum of \$50. was ordered drawn on the Treasury in favor of the Marvelous Marin Band, as the Town's contribution towards the Band's uniform fund, such warrant to be drawn from the advertising fund of said Town.

On motion of Councilman Dos Reis, seconded by Councilman Linch, and unanimously passing, Warrant No. 1951 was ordered paid.

The petition of property owners in the district requesting that Lots 152 to 156, inclusive, Ross Valley Park, Sub. 1, was presented to the Council and thereafter was referred to the Clerk for checking, with the request to report back at the next meeting.

Councilman Dempsey introduced Resolution No. 110, Improvement of portions of Sir Francis Drake Blvd., and moved its adoption. Resolution was seconded by Councilman White and adopted by a unanimous vote of the Council.

ORDINANCE NO. 236: —

An Ordinance providing for the issuance of Bonds was presented for first reading and was read.

On motion of Councilman Linch, seconded by Councilman White, and unanimously passing, the Mayor was authorized to handle all matters pertaining to the final consummation of the \$90,000.00 Municipal Investment Bond issue.

On motion of Councilman Linch, seconded by Councilman White, and unanimously passing, Mr. Ford's figure of \$150.00 for repairs on Upper Sturdivant Ave., as far as Mrs. Brooke's gate, was the lowest and best bid and was accepted by the Council.
