MINUTES OF OCTOBER 13th, 1936.

A regular meeting of the Council of the Town of San Anselmo was held on Tuesday, October 13th, 1936, at 8 o'clock P.M.

Present: Councilmen Franchini, Millard, Carroll, White and Linch.  
Absent: None.  
Mayor Linch presiding.

The minutes of several previous meetings were read and approved.

On motion of Councilman Franchini, seconded by Councilman Carroll, and unanimously passing, the Superintendent of Streets was authorized to remove a dangerously overhanging tree at 110 Hillside Ave. and the Clerk was instructed to so notify Mrs. Cooley, who reported the hazard.

A letter of thanks to the City Council from the Local Post of the American Legion was received and placed on file.

Similar action was taken on a communication signed A. J. Marshall, concerning the observance of "Navy Day" in San Anselmo, on October 27th.

On motion of Councilman Franchini, seconded by Councilman Millard, and unanimously passing, the Purchasing Agent was authorized to make certain expenditures for the Fire, Police, Parks and Housing and Street Departments, also for the Tax Collector, as set forth in his written request of even date.

The report of the Building Inspector for the month of September was received and placed on file.

An amended assessment and diagram for the segregation and apportionment of future installments of Assessment No. 14, under Resolution of Intention No. 88, covering portions of Lot "E", as per Map of the Rosenthal Tract, as prepared by the Superintendent of Streets was filed and the Clerk ordered the publication of a notice to the public of such

action and fixed Tuesday, November 10th, 1936, at 8 o'clock P.M. as the time for hearing protests against such amended assessment.

The following bids on concrete forms and reinforcing steel for the arch of the foot bridge opposite the Town Hall were received:

On motion of Councilman Carroll, seconded by Councilman White, and unanimously passing, the bid of E. G. Jackson on the work above mentioned was accepted.

IMPROVEMENT OF SIR FRANCIS DRAKE BLVD.

The following bids for the improvement of Sir Francis Drake Blvd. under the Gasoline Apportionment Tax were received and referred to the Engineer for checking:

After checking the several bids, the Engineer reported that the bid of E. A. Forde was low and well within his estimate of the cost of such work.

On motion of Councilman White, seconded by Councilman Franchini, and unanimously passing, E. A. Forde was awarded the contract for the work to be done on Sir Francis Drake Blvd., under Project No. 3, and the Clerk was directed to return all certified checks to the unsuccessful bidders and thank them for submitting their bids.

RESOLUTION NO. 114:

Councilman Franchini introduced Resolution No. 114, authorizing the Mayor to sign all papers or documents in connection with the improvement of Sir Francis Drake Blvd., and moved its adoption. Resolution was seconded by Councilman White and was passed and adopted by the following vote:

Ayes: Councilmen Franchini, Millard, Carroll, White and Linch.  
Noes: None.

WARRANTS:

On motion of Councilman Millard, Warrants Nos. 2289 to 2352, incl. were ordered paid. Motion was seconded by Councilman White and carried unanimously.

On motion of Councilman Carroll, seconded by Councilman Franchini, and unanimously passing, the Superintendent of Streets was authorized to install reflector traffic buttons at certain locations deemed necessary by the Police Department, such installations not to exceed \$60.00.

On motion of Councilman Carroll, seconded by Councilman Franchini,

and unanimously passing, the Superintendent of Streets was authorized to enter into an agreement with the County in connection with painting the center traffic line on Sir Francis Drake Blvd. and Red Hill Ave. throughout the Town limits, with the understanding that the County furnish the paint, labor and necessary marking equipment at a cost not in excess of \$100. to the Town.

On motion of Councilman White, seconded by Councilman Millard, and unanimously passing, the Superintendent of Streets was authorized to make certain repairs to the unpaved streets recently oiled, the cost of which shall be not in excess of \$150.00.

RESOLUTION NO. 115: (Foreclosure on Delinquent Street assessments.)

Councilman White introduced Resolution No. 115 authorizing the City Attorney to institute proceedings in the Superior Court for the foreclosure of all delinquent street assessments appearing on the Town Tax Rolls, and moved its adoption. Motion was seconded by Councilman Franchini and passed and adopted by the following vote:

Ayes: Councilmen Franchini, Millard, Carroll, White and Linch.  
Noes: None.

On motion of Councilman Carroll, seconded by Councilman White, and unanimously passing, the Superintendent of Streets was authorized to hire day labor in pouring concrete for the foot bridge arch at a figure not in excess of \$200.00.

The Engineer was asked to inspect the Arroyo Ave. Bridge and to report his findings to the Council at the next regular meeting.

The Attorney and Superintendent of Streets were instructed to take the necessary action to have all debris removed from the Creek running through certain sections of Ross Valley Park Tract.

On motion of Councilman White, seconded by Councilman Franchini, and unanimously passing, the Superintendent of Streets was authorized to have a "One hour parking sign" installed on Tunstead Ave. in front of the American Trust Co., also one on San Anselmo Ave. adjacent thereto.

On motion of Councilman Millard, seconded by Councilman White, and unanimously passing, the Clerk was instructed to inform the Theological Seminary Management that the tall eucalyptus trees fronting their property on Bolinas Ave. and Waverly Road constitute a menace to life and limb and therefore the City Council requests that either said trees be cut down or topped.

There being no further business, the meeting was adjourned to Tuesday, November 10, 1936, at 8 o'clock P.M.
