MINUTES OF MARCH 9, 1937.

A regular meeting of the Council of the Town of San Anselmo was held on Tuesday, March 9th, 1937, at the hour of 8 o'clock P.M.

Present: Councilmen Franchini, Millard, Carroll, White and Linch.
Absent: None.
Mayor Linch presiding.

The minutes of the meeting of February 11th were approved as read.

A letter of thanks from Mrs. Menotti was read and placed on file.

The request of Paul Gallette for the repair of a culvert adjoining his property in the Short Ranch was received and referred to the Street Committee for investigation.

The request of Geo. U. Hind, President of the Marin County Humane Society for additional funds was received and placed on file and the Clerk was asked to advise petitioner that the matter will be given consideration in making up the budget for the coming year.

A letter signed E. Ongaro, Fairfax, urging Council to pass a Plumbing Ordinance now under consideration was received and placed on file.

The notice of claim and demand of E. A. Albright, et ux, for \$2500. damages for injuries received by Mrs. Albright, purportedly due to a defective condition in the sidewalk area at 16 Richmond Road, was read and referred to the Attorney for consideration.

ORDINANCE NO. 242.

"An Ordinance fixing compensation of the City Treasurer of the Town of San Anselmo" was presented for final reading and adoption. It was thereafter signed by the Mayor and numbered 242.

On motion of Councilman Linch, seconded by Councilman Millard, Map of the proposed playground improvement was referred to the Parks and Housing Committee and the City Engineer, following unanimous vote of Council.

RESOLUTION NO. 121:

On motion of Councilman Linch, seconded by Councilman White, and unanimously passing, Resolution No. 121, closing and abandoning portions of San Diego Ave. and Los Angeles Blvd. was passed and adopted.

RESOLUTION NO. 122:

On motion of Councilman Franchini, seconded by Councilman Millard, and unanimously passing, Resolution No. 122, authorizing the City Engineer to prepare plans and specifications for contemplated improvement of San Anselmo Recreational Park was passed and adopted.

Mr. Blagg addressed the Council relative to a reciprocal license fee for merchants operating delivery vehicles through the Valley. The Council went on record as favoring the investigation of the plan.

Mr. Leavell, representing the Marin Milk Producers Assn., addressed the Council in reference to a contemplated milk delivery ordinance.

Mr. Jessup, representing the local plumbers, explained the workings of their proposed ordinance and urged Council's unanimous passage of same.

Mr. Dougherty, representing the Larkspur Lion's Club, addressed the Council concerning a Civil Service plan among Municipal employees which they were sponsoring, and asked Council's unanimous support of the plan.

The report of the Building Inspector for the past two months was received and placed on file.

The Clerk was instructed to arrange a meeting between the Council and the Board of Supervisors for the purpose of discussing fire protection outside of the corporate limits in the vicinity of Sleepy Hollow, also certain portions of the Short Ranch acreage.
