

MINUTES OF MARCH 18, 1937.

An adjourned regular meeting of the Council of the Town of San Anselmo was held on Thursday, March 18th, 1937, at 8 o'clock P.M.

Present: Councilmen Franchini, Carroll, White and Linch.
Absent: Councilman Millard.
Mayor Linch presiding.

The reading of the minutes of the last regular meeting was dispensed with.

In a written communication to the Council, Dr. Varon F. Smith offered to present one or two thoroughbred Doberman Pinscher dogs to the Police Department. After some discussion, the Chief of Police was instructed to look into the cost of having the animals trained for police work and to report back to the Council at its next meeting, and the Clerk was instructed to express Council's thanks for the offer.

The new Plumbing Ordinance was presented for first reading, and upon motion of Councilman Franchini, seconded by Councilman Linch, and un-animously passing, the reading thereof by title only was had.

On motion of Councilman White, Warrant No. 2544 was ordered cancelled and Warrant No. 2678 was ordered drawn in lieu thereof. Motion was seconded by Councilman Carroll and passed by the following vote:

Ayes: Councilmen Franchini, Carroll, White and Linch.
Absent: Councilman Millard.

On motion of Councilman White, Warrant in the amount of \$427.50 Numbered 2677, covering premium for public liability was ordered paid. Motion was seconded by Councilman Carroll and carried by the following vote:

Ayes: Councilmen Franchini, Carroll, White and Linch.
Absent: Councilman Millard.

Resolution # 123 On motion of Councilman Franchini, seconded by Councilman Carroll, and un-animously passing, plans and specifications for the new tennis courts, submitted by the Engineer were adopted, and the Clerk was instructed to advertise for bids for such work to be opened on April 13th, 1937, at 8 o'clock P.M.

The matter of entering a float in the "Fiesta Parade" was discussed by Council members; no action was taken.

On motion of Councilman Franchini, seconded by Councilman White, and un-animously passing, an old thirteen star flag and cane, offered by a resident of the Town, were gratefully accepted.

Mr. Fiscus addressed the Council in connection with a serious flood condition in his neighborhood, caused by filling in a natural water course. After some discussion, the matter was referred to the Street Com-

MINUTES OF APRIL 13TH, 1937.

A regular meeting of the Council of the Town of San Anselmo was held on Tuesday, April 13th, 1937, at 8 o'clock P.M.

Present: Councilmen Franchini, Millard, Carroll, White and Linch.

Absent: None.

The minutes of the meetings of March 9th and 18th were approved as read.

On motion of Councilman Franchini, seconded by Councilman Carroll, and unanimously passing, permission was granted Don Perry to remove certain trees fronting his property along Sir Francis Drake Blvd. north of Barber Avenue.

On motion of Councilman Carroll, seconded by Councilman Franchini, and unanimously passing, permission was granted Mr. Ferrero for the removal of a tree fronting his property on Belle Ave.

The following communications were received and placed on file:

- Geo. U. Hind, concerning additional contribution to the Humane Society;
- F. H. Allen, in reference to changing the name of Sir Francis Drake Blvd. and from the Chamber of Commerce, Santa Rosa, proposing holiday for the Golden Gate Bridge Fiesta.

The petition of A. U. Welch, 118 Laurel Ave., for the removal of an abandoned building on the land adjoining his ^{Property} Avenue was read and the Clerk was asked to notify the writer that the Council has no objection, providing petitioner will assume all responsibility in connection with such removal.

The petition of the Morningside Court Improvement Club for the lowering of a rock ledge in the Creek, running through the Cordone Tract, was referred to the Street Committee for recommendation.

A communication from J. D. Holbrook, Chairman of the San Anselmo Recreation Park and Playground Committee, offering to turn over to the City Council all moneys remaining on hand, totaling \$220.25, and urging Council to begin installation of recreational equipment, was received and placed on file and the Clerk was instructed to acknowledge with thanks such offer.

The petition of the Telephone Company to install additional conduit, cable and one manhole about September 1st, 1937, was received and the matter was referred to the Street Committee for consideration.
