

MINUTES OF AUGUST 26, 1938.

An adjourned regular meeting was held by the Council on Friday, August 26th, 1938, at 8 o'clock P.M.

Present: Councilmen White, Millard, Carroll and Linch.
Absent: Councilman Franchini.
Mayor Linch presiding.

The reading of the minutes of August 16th was dispensed with.

A letter of appreciation for street repairs to Scenic Avenue was received from Mr. J. M. Meredith, a taxpayer in said district.

A communication from the Pacific Coast Association of Fire Chiefs, urging Council to send the Chief of local department to its convention, to be held in Salt Lake City on September 19th, to 22nd, was received and placed on file.

On motion of Councilman White, seconded by Councilman Millard, and unanimously passing, a warrant in the sum of \$50.00 was ordered drawn to cover expenses of the Fire Chief in attending said convention.

The petition of E. G. Harrington for a street light in Bella Vista Tract was referred to the Supt. of Streets with power to order such installation.

A report was received from S. F. Butler, Sanitary Inspector of the State Department of Public Health, recommending to the City Health Officer that a rat poisoning campaign be conducted throughout the City, with the view to reducing rat population therein, also one recommending that notices be served on Mr. V. Copa and A. Wilson to make necessary repairs to faulty sewage disposal on the premises at 1363 Sir Francis Drake Blvd. Both matters were referred to the Health Officer and Chief of Police.

The City Engineer reported that his recommendations in connection with the construction of a service station over the San Anselmo Creek were not being carried out fully.

Council instructed the Building Inspector to notify the Contractor at once to follow the City Engineer's recommendations closely or cease operations; also to place on file in the City Hall a copy of the plans and specifications covering such construction, as per agreement.

and unanimously passing, the Fire Chief's car was ordered equipped with a radio set.

On motion of Councilman Carroll, seconded by Councilman White, and unanimously passing, Mr. J. Page was granted permission to remove a leaning tree on his property known as Lot 12, Re Sub. of Lots 161a to 166 incl., as per Map of the Bush Tract.

On motion of Councilman Carroll, seconded by Councilman White, and unanimously passing, the following tax rates for the year 1938-39 were set:

MINUTES OF SEPTEMBER 13th, 1938.

A regular meeting of the Council of San Anselmo was held on Tuesday, September 13th, 1938, at 8 o'clock P.M.

Present: Councilmen White, Millard, Carroll and Linch.
Absent: Councilman Franchini.
Mayor Linch presiding.

The minutes of the meetings of August 16th and 26th were approved as read.

Acknowledgment of floral offerings by Mrs. Oxtoby was received and placed on file.

The petition of L. Lossius and others, protesting a nuisance on Dr. Flood's property, Scenic Ave., was read and after much discussion, the Council agreed to visit the premises on Saturday next and decide whether or not petitioners should serve notice on Dr. Flood to abate such nuisance.

On recommendation on the Superintendent of Streets permission was granted Mr. Rickey to remove the tree referred to in his letter of September 12th, and the Clerk was instructed to so notify writer.
