On motion of Councilman Millard, seconded by Councilman Carroll, and unanimously passing, Will G. Peters was re-appointed Member of the Board of Review of the Civil Service Commission for a term of six years ending January 15th, 1946.

MINUTES OF FEBRUARY 13th, 1940.

A regular meeting of the Council was held on February 13th, 1940 at 8 o'clock P.M. Present: Councilmen Franchini, Millard, Carroll and Linch.

Absent: Councilman White.

Mayor Linch presiding.

The minutes of the past several meetings were approved as read.

✓ Petitions from many taxpayers and residents of the Town were received, requesting that Council enact an ordinance that will prevent dogs from being allowed to roam the streets unleashed, and after listening to both sides of the question, on motion of Councilman Millard, seconded by Councilman Carroll, and unanimously passing, the Attorney was instructed to prepare an Ordinance/prohibiting dogs from roaming the streets excepting under a leash.

✓ The request for a donation in its annual drive for funds was received from the Marin Musical Chest and referred to the Finance Committee for consideration.

✓ A communication was received from the City Engineer of San Rafael asking that the Town of San Anselmo meet part of the expense contemplated by San Rafael in a drainage problem which has recently developed along Ross Valley Drive at Highland. The matter was referred to the Superintendent of Streets for recommendation.

RESOLUTION NO. 214 ✓ On motion of Councilman Carroll, seconded by Councilman Millard, and unanimously passing, Sanitary District No. 1 was given permission to proceed towards forming a district to take care of sanitation from the end of existing trunk line on Butterfield Road into the Sleepy Hollow Tract.

✓ On motion of Councilman Millard, seconded by Councilman Carroll, and unanimously passing, Councilman White was granted permission to leave the State for a period of thirty days, retroactive from February 1st, 1940.

RESOLUTION NO. 215 ✓ -(EXECUTION DEED TO PACHECO): On motion of Councilman Millard, seconded by Councilman Franchini, and unanimously passing, Resolution No. 215, authorizing the Mayor and Clerk to execute a deed conveying the
