

RESOLUTION NO. 288:

Councilman White introduced and moved the adoption of Resolution No. 288, fixing the fair market value of Lots 6,7,8,9,11,21,26,29, 30,31,32,35,36,44,45,46,47,48,49,50,51,52,53,54,55,68,69,70,71,72,73,74, 75,76,77 and 78 of Morningside Court No. 2, at \$60. each, or a total of \$2,100.; also the Mayor and Clerk were authorized to execute a deed conveying the above mentioned property to the San Rafael Land Title Company and the Tax Collector was authorized to cancel all delinquent charges against the above property up to and including the date of said deed.

Councilman Franchini seconded this motion and it was unanimously adopted.

There being no further business, the meeting was adjourned to Tuesday, June 10th, 1941 at 8 o'clock P.M.

MINUTES OF JUNE 10th, 1941.

A regular meeting of the Council was held on June 10th, 1941, at 8 o'clock P.M. Present: Councilmen White, Franchini, Millard, Carroll and Linch.  
Mayor Linch presiding.

Reading of the Minutes was dispensed with.

On motion of Councilman Franchini, seconded by Councilman Millard, and unanimously passing, Miss Valerie Ansel and Fred Carpenter were reappointed Members of the Library Board for a full term.

A written request was received from the Library Board for a one cent additional tax for the operation and maintenance of the Library for the coming year and the matter was referred to the Finance Committee for consideration.

On motion of Councilman Franchini, seconded by Councilman Carroll, and unanimously passing, the Superintendent of Streets was authorized to put in a turn around at the end of Allyn Avenue, as set forth in a petition received from Mrs. J. Delaney and other property owners in the District.

The Clerk was instructed to inform Mr. McMaster that the Council is in no way obligated to make the improvements along Spring Grove Avenue, as set forth in his letter of May 19th.

The Superintendent of Streets reported that certain repairs to the road leading into Idalia Court have been made.

On motion of Councilman Franchini, seconded by Councilman

Millard, and unanimously passing, a check in the sum of \$50.00 was ordered paid to the San Anselmo Baseball Team to help defray the expense of furnishing suits for the ball players.

The Superintendent of Streets was authorized to run a pipe line to a point in front of the grandstand which will provide drinking water for the players.

RESOLUTION NO. 289 - (REJECTING LIQUOR LICENSE TO E. CANOBI):

On motion of Councilman White, seconded by Councilman Millard, and unanimously passing, Resolution No. 289, <sup>recommending</sup> the rejection of the Retailers' on sale wine, beer, and distilled spirits license application of Elaine L. Canobi was adopted.

RESOLUTION NO. 290 - (REGISTRATION OF GREYHOUND BUSES IN MARIN COUNTY):

On motion of Councilman White, seconded by Councilman Millard, and unanimously passing, Resolution No. 290, petitioning the Greyhound Lines to have such buses, as are used in the Marin Commuter Service, registered in this County, was adopted.

The reports of the Building and Plumbing Inspectors for the month of May were received and placed on file.

WARRANTS:

On motion of Councilman Millard, Warrants Nos. 6527 to 6592, inclusive, were ordered paid. Motion was seconded by Councilman White and carried by the following vote:

Mr. Frank O'Connor addressed the Council in connection with alleged speeding of delivery trucks in the Barber Tract. He was asked to furnish names or license numbers of such traffic violaters, if possible, to the Chief of Police. He also spoke against the proposed increases of Greyhound commute rates, which he understands will be put into effect on or about July 1st of this year. The Mayor informed Mr. O'Connor that he would personally call upon the Greyhound people with the view to ascertaining if there is any foundation to such rumors.

RESOLUTION NO. 291 (BROADENING POLICE POWERS):

On motion of Councilman Franchini, seconded by Councilman Carroll, and unanimously passing, Resolution No. 291, authorizing the Chief of Police or any of his officers to leave the City limits in line of duty in cases of emergency, was adopted.

The Chief of Police recommended restricted parking areas in

The minutes of the meetings of May 13th, 20th and 21st, also those of June 10th and 24th, 1941 were approved as read.

Applications for auditing the Town books and accounts were received from the firms of Gordon Rowe Co. and Lester, Herrick & Herrick.

On motion of Councilman Millard, seconded by Councilman Franchini and unanimously passing, the bid of Lester, Herrick & Herrick in the sum of \$175. was accepted.

A petition was received from the Hawthorn Hills Improvement Club outlining certain street work and drainage problems in their district and the Clerk was instructed to inform the writer that Council will contact Mr. Craigie Sharp upon his return from vacation and discuss such matters in detail before proceeding with any work in said district.

A communication was received from Mr. Wm. R. Lawson, Administrator for the W.P.A., informing Council that he was forced to curtail the San Anselmo Recreation Project, due to lack of funds.

A communication was received from Mr. Thos. W. Peryam, Agricultural Commissioner, recommending that Council take the necessary steps to combat the "elm leaf beetle", reported to be damaging Ross Valley trees.

The application of Donald Giesy for a position of Director of Recreation was received and the matter was referred to the budget committee
