

RESOLUTION NO. 294 - (FINAL HEARING ON REZONING ORTHORBER LOT):

On motion of Councilman Franchini, seconded by Councilman Millard, and unanimously passing, Resolution No. 294, fixing July 16th as the time for Council to hold its final hearing in the matter of rezoning of the property referred to in Resolution No. 293, and providing for publication of notice, etc. was adopted.

The Clerk was instructed to advise Mr. F. H. Allen that the Council, after investigation and consultation with the City Engineer, believe that the Town is in no way obligated to install the sewer referred to in his communication of June 12th.

On motion duly made and carried, Councilman White was granted a thirty day leave of absence from the State.

Vic Valentini appeared before the Council and reported a major drainage problem on Mariposa Avenue, and after some discussion the matter was referred to the Engineer for consideration.

The reports of the Plumbing and Building Inspectors for the month of June were received and placed on file.

RESOLUTION NO. 295 (EMPLOYEES AFFECTED BY SELECTIVE SERVICE DRAFT):

On motion of Councilman Franchini, seconded by Councilman White, and unanimously passing, Resolution No. 295, providing for job security of Town employees, affected by the selective service draft, was adopted.

There being no further business, the meeting was adjourned to July 16th at 8 o'clock P.M.

MINUTES OF JULY 16TH, 1941.

A regular meeting of the Council was held on July 16th, 1941 at 8 o'clock P.M. Present: Councilmen: Franchini, Millard, Carroll and Linch
Absent: Councilman White.
Mayor Linch presiding.

The minutes of the previous meeting were approved as read.

A communication was received from Roger F. Sohner, calling Council's attention to careless grass burning along the N.W. P. Right of Way.

A written demand in the sum of Ten Dollars (\$10.00) for alleged scorching of shrubbery during the Fire Department's clearing programme was received from Mr. C. W. Boice, 29 Valley Road. The matter was referred to the Attorney, who was instructed to reply.

On motion of Councilman Franchini, seconded by Councilman Carroll and unanimously passing, the Tax Collector was authorized to cancel an unused

business license and refund the sum of \$15.00 to Mr. K. Yarovikoff.

The off sale beer and wine permit of Mr. Deringer was transferred to S. Cordeiro and Arthur Souza, new operators of El Centro Market, on Red Hill Avenue.

WARRANTS:

On motion of Councilman Millard, Warrants Nos. 6597 to 6676, inclusive, were ordered paid. Motion was seconded by Councilman Franchini, and passed by the following vote: Ayes: Councilmen Franchini, Millard, Carroll and Linch. Noes: None. Absent: Councilman White.

RESOLUTION NO. 296 (OPTION STREET IMPROVEMENT BONDS - MORNINGSIDE CT. NO. 2):

On motion of Councilman Franchini, seconded by Councilman Carroll, and unanimously passing, Resolution No. 296, providing for the acceptance of a one year option by the Anglo California National Bank to purchase Morningside Court Street Bonds, as outlined in a written agreement, was adopted.

ORDINANCE ²⁶⁷ (RE-ZONING OF ORTHORBER LOT - LINDA VISTA TRACT):

An Ordinance, amending Ordinance No. 254, entitled, "An Ordinance regulating and establishing locations of industries, businesses and dwellings in the Town; establishing districts or zones, etc. was presented for first reading and was read.

Mr. Knowlton addressed Council in connection with the National Aluminum drive, briefly outlining such activity, requesting publicity through the local press, and urging the Mayor to organize a committee sponsoring the movement.

On motion of Councilman Millard, seconded by Councilman Franchini, and unanimously passing, Councilman Carroll and Fire Chief Marcucci were granted permission to leave the State to attend the Pacific Coast Firemen's Convention to be held in Reno, Nevada, in September, and the sum of \$125.00 was voted to defray expenses incidental to the trip.

On motion of Councilman Carroll, seconded by Councilman Millard, and unanimously passing, Councilman Franchini was granted permission to leave the State for a period of thirty days, beginning August 25th, 1941.

There being no further business, the meeting was adjourned to Tuesday, August 12th, 1941 at 8 o'clock P.M.
