

MINUTES OF OCTOBER 14th, 1941.

A regular meeting of the Council was held on October 14th, 1941, at 8 o'clock P.M.

Present: Councilman White, Franchini, Millard, Carroll and Linch.
Absent: None.
Mayor Linch presiding.

Minutes of regular meeting of September 17th and the Special Meeting of October 2nd, 1941, were approved as read.

Letters of thanks were received from the following organizations; Red Hill Parent Teachers Ass'n. for lessening the traffic hazard in the vicinity of the School,- Marin County Humane Society for \$30.00 increase in Town's Annual payment of dues and from the San Anselmo Public Library Board for Council's action in meeting the Library's budget of \$3750.00 for the current year.

The petition of Eda G. DiGrazia and others for relief from faulty drainage on Elm and San Anselmo Avenues in the vicinity of the Yolansdale School, was referred to the Superintendent of Streets and the City Engineer for recommendation.

The petition of Jeanette J. Laurin and others urging Council to rid their neighborhood of a barking and vicious dog belonging to Donald C. Perry, #38 Ross Ave. was read. The City Attorney reported that he and the Chief of Police would consult the ordinance governing such nuisances and act accordingly.

A reply to Council's communication of September 18th, concerning existing traffic hazard at Greenbrea and Alto intersections was received from the California Highway Commission and placed on file.

ORDINANCE #263 (CREEK CLEARING).

"An Ordinance providing for the cleaning of all creeks, channels and water courses in the Town of San Anselmo, the removal of all debris and obstructions therefrom; declaring any obstruction to creek or water course to be a public nuisance, and providing for the violation of this Ordinance," was presented for final reading.

On motion of Councilman Franchini, seconded by Councilman White and unanimously passing, such reading was by Title only.

On motion of Councilman White, seconded by Councilman Franchini, the Ordinance was passed and adopted unanimously. Thereafter it was signed by the Mayor and numbered 263.

On motion of Councilman Carroll seconded by Councilman White the Superintendent of Streets was instructed to proceed at once on the creek clearing job.

The reports of the Building & Plumbing Inspectors for the month of September were received and placed on file.

On motion of Councilman White seconded by Councilman Millard and unanimously passing a warrant in the sum of \$25.00 was ordered drawn in favor of "Albert's Inc." to help defray the expense of furnishing rain coats for the Junior Traffic Patrol of Sir Francis Drake School.

RESOLUTION #303.

On motion of Councilman Millard seconded by Councilman White and unanimously passing, Resolution #303 fixing the fair market value of \$109.91 and authorizing the Mayor and Clerk to execute a deed from the Town conveying lot 5, Block 1, Sequoia Park Section 1 to the San Rafael Land Title Co. Also authorizing the Tax Collector to cancel all taxes appearing on his books as a lien against said property, was adopted. The reason for fixing the fair market value of said lot at \$109.91 is because it does not permit of a merchantable title.

On motion of Councilman Carroll, seconded by Councilman White and unanimously passing, William Campbell is to be paid time and one-half for both days spent in repairing the Ford Truck, covering his day off and one Sunday.

The Superintendent of Streets reported that in his opinion, the 1932 International Truck being used by the department is not worth expenditure of the amount necessary to put it in good repair.

The Purchasing Agent was authorized to purchase a truck for the Street Department not in excess of \$650.00.

On motion of Councilman White, seconded by Councilman Franchini, Resolution #304 authorizing the acceptance of a deed conveying a parcel of land to be known as a continuation of Broadmoor Ave. and declaring it a public street was passed and adopted unanimously.

WARRANTS.

On motion of Councilman Millard, warrants Nos. 6761 to 6816 inclusive were ordered paid. Motion was seconded by

Councilman White and carried by the following vote. Ayes, Councilman White, Franchini, Millard, Carroll and Linch. Noes, - none.

On motion of Councilman Millard, seconded by Councilman White and unanimously passing, John Bell was appointed on the night shift of the Fire Department, until such time as it is definitely known whether or not Charles Lezzeni will be accepted as a draftee in the U. S. Army. If so, Bell is to be appointed as a regular member of the Department and is to receive the starting salary of \$135.00 per month.

There being no further business the meeting was adjourned to Wednesday, October 22nd, 1941, at 8 o'clock P.M.
