Councilman Carroll spoke on the approaching Halloween entertainment for the children and suggested use of the parking lot on the north side of Tunstead Ave., also recommended halting of vehicular traffic along said Avenue during festivities. The Chief of Police offered full co-operation.

On motion of Councilman Millard, warrant #6817 was ordered paid, - motion was seconded by Councilman White and carried unanimously.

On motion of Councilman White, seconded by Councilman Millard and unanimously passing the Attorney was directed to prepare a Resolution petitioning the Railroad Commission for the re-opening of a crossing over the Right of Way of the N.W.P.R.R. Co. from Red Hill to Greenfield Avenues, approximately on block east of Sir Francis Drake Blvd.

It was agreed that Councilman Carroll and the Superintendent of Streets make a survey of Brookside Meadow Street lighting with the view to installing two additional lights in the territory. It was likewise agreed that hereafter, all such installations will be 100 C.P. lights.

A regular meeting of the Council was held on Wednesday, November 12th, 1941, at 8 o'clock P.M.
