MINUTES OF DECEMBER 9th, 1941.

A regular meeting of the Council was held on Tuesday, December 9th, 1941, at 8 o'clock P.M. Present: Councilmen Franchini, Carroll and Linch. Absent: Councilmen White and Millard. Mayor Linch presiding.

The reading of the minutes was dispensed with.

Permission was granted Margaret McWilliams to trim trees fronting her property at 166 Crescent Road, providing she replaces any which are removed.

A letter of thanks was received from Red Hill Parent Teachers for Council's help in providing raincoats for the Junior Patrol at Sir Francis Drake School.

The reports of the Building Inspector covering the months of October and November were received and placed on file. Similar action was taken on the Plumbing Inspector's report for the month of November.

RESOLUTION NO. 307:

On motion of Councilman Franchini, seconded by Councilman Carroll, and unanimously passing, Resolution No. 307, authorizing the Mayor and Clerk to execute a deed to Sara Tolmacheef for the sum of \$50. covering a portion of Lot 52, Bush Tract, was adopted. The Tax Collector was authorized to cancel all taxes or assessments appearing on his books as a lien against said premises.

ORDINANCE NO. 266: (REGULATING LIGHTING AND EXTINGUISHING SAME DURING EMERGENCIES.)

An Ordinance regulating the maintenance and operation of illumination and lights and providing for the extinguishing thereof in the event of emergencies in the Town of San Anselmo was presented for first reading and was read.

ORDINANCE NO. 267 (AMENDING TRAFFIC ORDINANCE NO. 207):

An ordinance amending Ordinance No. 207, regulating traffic

in emergencies was presented for first reading and was read.

On motion of Councilman Franchini, seconded by Councilman Carroll, and unanimously passing, Mr. Knox was granted permission to remove a dying Hawthorn tree fronting his property in Agatha Court, providing another be placed in its stead.

WARRANTS: On motion of Councilman Carroll, Warrants Nos. 6873 to 6909, incl. were ordered paid. Motion was seconded by Councilman Franchini, and carried by the following vote: Ayes: Councilmen Franchini, Carroll and Linch.  
Noes: None.  
Absent: Councilmen White and Millard.

On motion of Councilman Carroll, seconded by Councilman Linch, Councilman Franchini was appointed a member of the Finance Committee and authorized to sign the warrants referred to above.

On motion of Councilman Carroll, seconded by Councilman Franchini, and unanimously passing, the Purchasing Agent was authorized to procure certain equipment for the Police Department deemed necessary for civil defense programs.

On motion of Councilman Franchini, seconded by Councilman Carroll, and unanimously passing, the Chief of Police was authorized to appoint and train for emergency work fourteen men, and to pay them at the rate of 50¢ per hour, plus \$1.00 per day for the use of their cars while engaged in such occupation. Also, he was authorized to procure a number of "Closed Street" and "Detour" signs, and to arrange for emergency quarters in case of damage or destruction of the present civic center.

Otis Smith, representing a group of Marin County Contractors, addressed the Council relative to certain suggested changes in the Town's Building Ordinance governing plastering, foundation, chimney and fire place construction. After some discussion it was agreed that David Adams and the Mayor consult with the Board of Fire Underwriters before any action on the matter is taken by the City Council.

The Chief of Police requested Council to provide one additional police car and served notice that his own personal car will not be used in transacting official business after December 10th., 1941; this action terminates <sup>prior</sup> ~~a~~ agreement ~~where~~ and no gas or oil will be furnished the Police Chief by the Town for the use and operation of his personal car after the above mentioned date.

There being no further business, the meeting was adjourned
