MINUTES OF FEBRUARY 10th, 1942.

A regular meeting of the Council was held on Tuesday, February 10th, 1942, at 8 o'clock P.M.

The minutes of February 3rd were approved as read.

A communication from the League of California Cities relating to contemplated revision of the Election Code was received and filed.

The petition of Wm. A. Ferrari and others urging Council to adopt some definite plan with the view towards controlling flood waters throughout the Town, particularly in the business district where much damage was purported to have been done during the last storm was read. There was a general discussion of the subject ⁱⁿ which the Council, Engineer, Attorney and Superintendent of Streets informed the petitioners that the City has always done everything in its power to cope with the situation, such as meeting with various bodies, the County Supervisors, U.S. Army Engineers and other experts with the view towards forming a "flood control district", but that due to the enormous cost of such an undertaking it was considered prohibitive. It was further pointed out that quite a considerable sum of money was spent by the Town in clearing brush and debris from the creek several months ago in the hopes that a repetition of flood damage would be averted.

The reports of the Building and Plumbing Inspectors for the month of January, 1942 were received and filed.

The Engineer reported on certain matters concerning future expenditures of the 1/4% gas tax fund in relation to street improvements.
