MINUTES OF MAY 5, 1942.

An adjourned regular meeting of the Council was held on Tuesday, May 5th, 1942, at 8 o'clock P.M. Present: Councilmen White, Franchini, Von Rotz, Carroll and Linch. Absent: None. Mayor Linch presiding.

The minutes of the meeting of April 26th were approved as read.

On motion of Councilman Carroll, seconded by Councilman White, and unanimously passing, the resignation of J. N. Simon from the Fire Department was accepted, as of June 1st, 1942, allowing him his regular annual vacation of two weeks, beginning May 17th.

The request for raises in the Police Department was referred to the Finance Committee, who informed petitioners a definite answer to their request at the next regular meeting of the Council will be given.

A communication was received from the San Rafael Chamber of Commerce urging the City Council, as well as the Department heads, to accompany them on a trip to Vallejo to view housing projects, school expansions, street developments, etc., and to attend a luncheon at the Casa de Vallejo, where leading authorities in each department of Vallejo's City government will explain how they handled the problem of a one hundred per cent increase in population in a relatively short time; about eight or ten representatives were expected to attend.

The request of the Plumbing Inspector to have the approval of the City Council on certain rules provided for in Section "D" of Ordinance 269, recently adopted, was referred to the Chairman of the Building Commission for consideration.

The request for financial aid to the local baseball team was referred to the Chairman of the Finance Committee, who will make his recommendation at the next regular meeting. Similar action was taken in connection with the request for payment of annual dues to the Marin Musical Chest.

The matter of determining J. M. Lewis' Civil Service status as a municipal employee of the Town of San Anselmo was held over until next regular meeting of the Council.

Following a lengthy discussion on Civil Defense problems, <sup>and</sup> the purchasing of equipment recommended by local co-ordinators of defense, the

Mayor informed members of the group that at the County Defense Co-ordinators Meeting, scheduled for Friday, May 8th, detailed lists of equipment to be furnished each incorporated town in the County will be prepared and presented to the Board of Supervisors at its meeting of May 18th.

On motion of Councilman Carroll, Warrant No. 7125 was ordered paid. Motion was seconded by Councilman Von Rotz and carried by the following vote: Ayes: Councilmen White, Franchini, Von Rotz, Carroll and Linch.
