MINUTES OF MAY 14th, 1942.

An adjourned regular meeting of the City Council was held on Thursday, May 14th, 1942, at 8 o'clock P.M. Present: Councilmen White, Franchini, Von Rotz, Carroll and Linch.

Absent: None.
Mayor Linch presiding.

The minutes of May 5th and 12th were approved as read.

Letters urging Council to vote salary raises for the Police Department were received from the following persons: Robert Bassett, 1572 Sir Francis Drake Blvd., Gene Hogle, 14 Brookmont Circle and Mrs. Mignon Walker, 53 Woodland Ave. Several petitions containing the names of many residents and tax payers urging similar action by the City Council were received and placed on file.

A refund amounting to \$192.86 on the annual insurance premium of the Town was received from the Minto & Wilkie Insurance Agency, due to a reduction in rates effective as of July 1st, 1941.

The reports of the Building and Plumbing Inspectors for the month of April were received and placed on file.

RESOLUTION NO. 320 (DESIGNATING ONE POLICE OFFICER AS "CAPTAIN"):

On motion of Councilman Franchini, seconded by Councilman White, and unanimously passing, Resolution No. 320, designating one officer in the Police Department as "Captain", who shall be in charge during the absence of the Chief, was adopted.

RESOLUTION NO. 321 APPOINTING R.M. OVERDICK CITY CONTROLLER):

On motion of Councilman Franchini, seconded by Councilman Carroll and unanimously passing, Resolution No. 321, Providing for the appointment of R.M. Overdick as City Controller at a monthly salary of \$210., beginning May 1st, 1942, was adopted.

On motion of Councilman White, seconded by Councilman Franchini, and unanimously passing, the resignation of Judge Paul Helmore, as City Judge, as of June 1st, 1942, was accepted.

On motion of Councilman White, seconded by Councilman Von Rotz, and unanimously passing, F. J. Crisp was appointed City Judge of San Anselmo at a salary of \$25. per month, effective June 1st, 1942. / Until further notice court will convene every other Monday.

A telegram was received from Bechtel & Co. stating that no municipal employee will be hired in their Sausalito shipyard without first contacting the City officials.

RESOLUTION NO. 322 (SALARY RAISES FOR POLICE, FIRE & STREET DEPTS.):

On motion of Councilman White, seconded by Councilman Franchini, and unanimously passing, Resolution No. 322, providing for salary increases of employees of the Police, Fire and Street Departments was adopted.

On motion of Councilman Franchini, a warrant in the sum of \$25. was ordered drawn in favor of the Marin Municipal Chest. Motion was seconded by Councilmen White and carried by the following vote: Ayes: Councilmen White, Franchini, Von Rotz, Carroll and Linch. Noes: None.

On motion of Councilman Carroll, Warrants Nos. 7123 to 7167, incl., were ordered paid. Motion was seconded by Councilman Von Rotz and carried by the following vote: Ayes: Councilmen White, Franchini, Von Rotz, Carroll and Linch. Noes: None.

An Ordinance amending Civil Service Ordinance No. 244 of the Town of San Anselmo was presented for first reading and was read.

On motion of Councilman White, seconded by Councilman Franchini,

and unanimously passing, Henry Vonderheide was appointed driver in the Fire Department at a monthly salary of \$170., beginning May 18th, 1942.

On motion of Councilman White, seconded by Councilman Franchini, and unanimously passing, Mr. Sohner was authorized to trim any and all trees which in his judgment interfere with the fire alarm system.

Mr. Pechner addressed Council and urged that immediate steps be taken to furnish sand to be used in Civilian defense.

On motion of Councilman White, seconded by Councilman Von Rotz, and unanimously passing, the Superintendent of Streets was authorized to purchase so much Tocaloma sand, as in his judgment he deems necessary for this emergency, at the price of 75¢ per yard.

Mr. Harper requested Council to take immediate steps to procure necessary blackout lights for all vehicles used in Civilian defense emergencies.

There being no further business, the meeting was adjourned to May 19th, 1942, at 8 o'clock P.M.
