Siemer was authorized to represent San Anselmo and sit in conference with the officials of the Marin Shipbuilding Division and the Maritime Commission, in working out plans for the development of a "Ship Yard City" to be built in the vicinity of Waldo Point, and the Clerk was directed to so notify Mr. H. W. Von Morpurgo of the Marin Shipbuilding Division of the Bechtel Company, Mills Bldg., San Francisco.
