


Councilman Carroll made a motion seconded by Councilman Von Rotz that the appointment of Mr. Philip Fahey as a patrol officer at a monthly salary of \$165.00, to start work on or about September 15th, 1942, be approved. Mr. Fahey is to serve under a temporary appointment for the duration and then to be given a permanent rating under the Civil Service Ordinance, if the position should then exist, all of which is in accordance with that resolution amending the Civil Service Ordinance, due to the emergency. The appointment was approved unanimously.

Warrants Nos. 7287 to 7291 were unanimously approved upon the motion of Councilman Carroll, seconded by Councilman Von Rotz.

MINUTES OF SEPTEMBER 8, 1942.

A regular meeting of the Council was held on Tuesday, September 8th, 1942, at 8 o'clock P.M.

Present: Councilmen White, Mason, Von Rotz, Carroll and Linch.

Absent: None.  
Mayor Linch presiding.

The minutes of the meeting of August 26, 1942 were approved as read.

A communication was received from the local American Legion Post, seeking the co-operation of civic authorities in connection with the Disabled Vets Forget-me-Not drive on Wednesday, September 9th; same was placed on file.

The written resignation of F.J. Crisp, as a member of the City Planning Commission was received and filed.

On motion of Councilman White, seconded by Councilman Von Rotz, and unanimously passing, such resignation was accepted.

The reports of the Building and Plumbing Inspectors for the month of August, 1942, were read and filed.

On motion of Councilman White, seconded by Councilman Von Rotz, and unanimously passing, the fair market value of a certain parcel of land, known as Lot "E", Block 5, Morningside Court, No. 1, was set at \$475.00.

On motion of Councilman White, seconded by Councilman Von Rotz, and unanimously passing, the Mayor and Clerk were authorized to execute a deed conveying said parcel of land to Katherine M. Beers, et al,

for the sum of \$475.00, and the Tax Collector was authorized to cancel all taxes or assessments appearing on his books as a lien against said property, as of this date.

On motion of Councilman Carroll, seconded by Councilman Von Rotz, and unanimously passing, the Chief of Police was authorized to employ a special officer for night patrol work for a period of 15 days at the rate of \$5.00 per diem.

On motion of Councilman Carroll, seconded by Councilman White, and unanimously carrying, the Chief of Police was authorized to attend the Peace Officers Annual convention to be held in Los Angeles on October 22nd to 24th, inclusive, and a warrant was ordered drawn in the amount of \$75.00 to defray his expenses.
