Councilman Von Rotz discussed the Park Development program and that tree planting will undoubtedly start in February 1943. He also reported that the footbridge from Lincoln Park to Sir Francis Drake Blvd. at about the Union and Standard Service Stations was in bad condition and would have to be repaired in the near future. He also reported that the fire hydrant on the west side of Sir Francis Drake Blvd. opposite the Tamalpais Theatre has been knocked over four times and should be removed but that this was impossible at this time due to inability to get the necessary cast iron pipe. ⁴⁰

An ~~adjourned~~ regular meeting of the City Council was held on Tuesday, January 12, 1943, at 8 o'clock P.M.

The minutes of the meeting of January 5th were read and approved.

Communications received from Mrs. Felice B. Lutters, 194 Butterfield Road, San Anselmo relative to the overgrown condition and excessive growth of trees on a lot adjacent to her property, known as lot #65 Short Ranch #1, which she alleges belongs to the City. In as much as the City does have a tax deed to this property it was ordered that Supt. of Streets Marcucci should clean up the condition of the property to some extent. ⁵
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Councilman Mason introduced an ordinance to amend Ordinance #195 fixing the salaries of the City Clerk and City Treasurer which was read in full. ³⁵⁻⁷⁻³⁸

A Resolution fixing the duties of the City Controller pursuant to Ordinances #264 and #244 was read and filed. ⁴³⁻

Councilman White introduced an Ordinance to amend the Garbage Ordinance #253, setting new rates for the collection of garbage. ³⁵⁻²⁴

Councilman Monte moved the approval and payment of Warrants #7486 to 7534 inclusive. This motion was seconded by Councilman White and was adopted unanimously.

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Councilman White moved that Mr. Walter Phillips be appointed a hoseman in the Fire Department starting January 15, 1943 at a salary of \$165.00 plus the war time adjustment of \$10.00 per month. This motion was seconded by Councilman Von Rotz and was adopted unanimously.

Councilman Von Rotz made the motion that the Chief of Police be authorized to have the necessary signs made and cause to be placed whereby the public will be warned that illegal dumping shall not continue.
