MINUTES OF APRIL 27, 1943.

The meeting of the Council called for April 27, 1943 was adjourned by the Clerk to Tuesday, May 4th, 1943, at 8 o'clock P.M. for the reason that a quorum was not present. Read and approved May 4, 1943 Ray M. Overdick Clerk. 90

MINUTES OF MAY 4, 1943.

An adjourned regular meeting of the City Council was held on Tuesday, May 4, 1943 at 8:00 o'clock.

Present: Councilmen White, Von Rotz, Linch and Monte.

Absent: Councilman Mason. Mayor Linch presiding. 170

The minutes of the meetings of April 13 and April 27, 1943 were read and approved. 190

The Council set forth as the policy for the present year relative to vacations in the Fire Department that the men work all or a part of the vacation period and were to be paid for the portion worked, in addition to their regular vacation pay. 38

The Clerk was instructed to act as clerk of the Court while the Court is in session. 9-38-3V

Officer Eli G. Harrington was granted a salary increase of \$10.00 per month to take effect as of May 1, 1943, upon the motion of Councilman Monte, which was seconded by Councilman VonRotz and was adopted unanimously. 39-19-38 320

Mayor Linch appointed Councilman Monte as Police Commissioner during the absence of Councilman Mason. 9- 380

Councilman White moved that the City accept the offer of S. Knoles to supply a Reo Flat Bed Truck to be used in connection with Civilian Defense to carry a skid mounted fire pumper furnished to the City by OCD. This truck is to be insured and maintained by the City and to be returned to Mr. Knoles in its present condition, normal wear and tear excepted. This motion was seconded by Councilman Von Rotz and was adopted unanimously. 17 310

The details of the plan of construction for the Roll of Honor were explained to the Council. Councilman White made the motion that the construction go forward as planned. This motion was seconded by Councilman Monte and was adopted unanimously. 6

Councilman Von Rotz made the motion that a fan be purchased and installed in the Civilian Defense control room in accord with the recommendations of the State officials of the Office of Civilian Defense. The motion was <sup>19</sup>seconded by Councilman White and was unanimously adopted.

There being no further business the meeting was adjourned to Tuesday, May 11, 1943 at 8:00 o'clock P.M.

MINUTES OF MAY 11, 1943.

A regular meeting of the City Council was held on Tuesday, May 11, 1943, at 8:00 o'clock P.M.

- Present: Councilmen Von Rotz, Linch, Monte and White.
- Absent: Councilman Mason,  
Mayor Linch presiding.

The reading of the minutes of May 4, 1943 was dispensed with.

Councilman White made the motion that the City advance the sum of \$250.00 to start the financing of a plan of supervised playground recreation for the summer months in 1943 made necessary due to the inability of many to get away for a summer vacation due to the present war emergency. It is understood that the above amount will be equaled by public subscription and that the City will match all amounts raised up to the sum of \$500.00, including the initial \$250. This motion was seconded by Councilman Monte and was adopted unanimously..

Minutes of the meeting of the Planning Commission held on April 26, 1943 were read and filed.

The City Council again went on record to the effect that they are definitely opposed to the idea of spot zoning for any purpose whatsoever, as per the motion of Councilman Von Rotz, which was seconded by Councilman White and was adopted unanimously.

Mr. Carl Mak and Mr. Don Works were reappointed to the Planning Commission for a period of four years, their terms having expired on April 18, 1943, as per the motion of Councilman Monte, seconded by Councilman White and which was adopted unanimously.
