MINUTES OF MAY 11, 1943.

A regular meeting of the City Council was held on Tuesday, May 11, 1943, at 8:00 o'clock P.M.

- Present: Councilmen Von Rotz, Linch, Monte and White.
- Absent: Councilman Mason,  
 Mayor Linch presiding.

The reading of the minutes of May 4, 1943 was dispensed with.

Councilman White made the motion that the City advance the sum of \$250.00 to start the financing of a plan of supervised playground recreation for the summer months in 1943 made necessary due to the inability of many to get away for a summer vacation due to the present war emergency. It is understood that the above amount will be equaled by public subscription and that the City will match all amounts raised up to the sum of \$500.00, including the initial \$250. This motion was seconded by Councilman Monte and was adopted unanimously..

Minutes of the meeting of the Planning Commission held on April 26, 1943 were read and filed.

The City Council again went on record to the effect that they are definitely opposed to the idea of spot zoning for any purpose whatsoever, as per the motion of Councilman Von Rotz, which was seconded by Councilman White and was adopted unanimously.

Mr. Carl Mak and Mr. Don Works were reappointed to the Planning Commission for a period of four years, their terms having expired on April 18, 1943, as per the motion of Councilman Monte, seconded by Councilman White and which was adopted unanimously.
