

MEETING OF AUGUST 10, 1943..

A regular meeting of the City Council was held on Tuesday August 10, 1943 at 8 o'clock P. M.

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Present: Councilmen Smith, Mason, Von Rotz, Monte and Linch.

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Absent: None
Mayor Linch presiding.

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Following protests from the members of the City Council and other taxpayers present Councilman Mason made a motion which was seconded by Mayor Linch and was adopted unanimously that, in accord with these protests the building inspector would refrain from issuing the required permit for the moving of a partially completed dwelling place from without the corporate limits to a site on San Francisco Blvd. owned by Mr. Nick P. Mashe.

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Mayor Linch made the motion which was seconded by Councilman Smith and was adopted unanimously that Councilman Von Rotz act as the chairman of a committee for the purpose of investigating the provisions of the Uniform Building Code, now in effect, and to report back to the Council with proposed legislation to prevent the construction of any structures which may tend to impair property values.

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Councilman Smith made the motion which was seconded by Mayor Linch and was adopted unanimously that warrants No. 7804 to 7849 inc. be passed for payment.

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Councilman Mason made the motion which was seconded by Councilman Smith and was adopted unanimously that Mr. Robert Christner be granted a permit for a temporary and removable structure to be placed upon the parking lot recently acquired from Rebecca Blumenfeld.

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Upon the motion of Councilman Von Rotz which was seconded by Councilman Monte and was adopted unanimously \$75.00 was appropriated to cover the cost of decorating the Civic Center in connection with the Honor Roll Celebration.

In amplification of the paragraph on page 267 of the minutes of March 9, 1943, it was the opinion of the Council that Mr. Thomas D. Minto had volunteered his service, in a sense of Civic pride, in his attempt to ascertain from the Railroad Company their best possible price for the property they own in San Anselmo, and that he was not representing the City as the duly authorized agent representative.

There being no further business the meeting was adjourned to Tuesday August 24, 1943 at 8 o'clock P. M.

MEETING OF SEPT. 14, 1943.

Monthly reports from the Building and Electrical Inspector, Plumbing inspector and the annual report from the Humane Society were received and filed. ²¹⁻¹¹

A copy of the minutes of the meeting of the City Planning Commission held on Sept. 9, 1943, was received and filed. ⁵⁶

RESOLUTION NO. 360. Based upon the report of the City Planning Commission dated Sept. 11, 1943 ⁴³⁻ relative to the application of Mr. George M. Ohlemutz for an adjustment to the provisions of the zoning ordinance No. 254, upon the motion of Councilman Von Rotz which was seconded by Councilman Monte and was adopted unanimously the findings of the Commission were upheld and Mr. Ohlemutz was granted his petition. ⁵⁶

Upon the motion of Councilman Mason which was seconded by Councilman Smith and was adopted unanimously Police Officer Gino Anselmi was granted a leave of absence effective Sept. 26, 1943, to enable him to enter the armed forces of the United States. ³⁸⁻³⁹

Upon the motion of Councilman Mason which was seconded by Councilman Smith and was adopted unanimously Manuel J. Azevedo was appointed as a Police Officer effective ³⁸⁻³⁹

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
