MEETING OF SEPT. 14, 1943.

A regular meeting of the City Council was held on Tuesday Sept. 14, 1943 at 8 o'clock P. M.

Present: - Councilman Mason, Smith, Von Rotz, Monte and Linch.

Absent: None

Mayor Linch presiding.

Monthly reports from the Building and Electrical Inspector, Plumbing inspector and the annual report from the Humane Society were received and filed. ²¹⁻¹¹

A copy of the minutes of the meeting of the City Planning Commission held on Sept. 9, 1943, was received and filed. ⁵⁶

RESOLUTION NO. 360. Based upon the report of the City Planning Commission dated Sept. 11, 1943 ⁴³⁻ relative to the application of Mr. George M. Ohlemutz for an adjustment to the provisions of the zoning ordinance No. 254, upon the motion of Councilman Von Rotz which was seconded by Councilman Monte and was adopted unanimously the findings of the Commission were upheld and Mr. Ohlemutz was granted his petition. ⁵⁶

Upon the motion of Councilman Mason which was seconded by Councilman Smith and was adopted unanimously Police Officer Gino Anselmi was granted a leave of absence effective Sept. 26, 1943, to enable him to enter the armed forces of the United States. ³⁸⁻³⁹

Upon the motion of Councilman Mason which was seconded by Councilman Smith and was adopted unanimously Manuel J. Azevedo was appointed as a Police Officer effective ³⁸⁻³⁹

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September 25, 1943 on a temporary basis under the provisions of the Civil Service Ordinance, replacing Officer Anselmi who is on a military ¹⁹ leave of absence; his salary to \$190.00 per month for the first three months and \$199.50 per month thereafter which amount includes the emergency raises for the duration only.

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Upon the motion of Councilman Monte which was seconded by Councilman Von Rotz and was adopted unanimously approval was granted to certain changes or adjustments in the tax rolls for the year ending June 30, 1943, as detailed in a letter from the City Clerk.

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Upon the Motion of Councilman Von Rotz which was seconded by Councilman Monte and was adopted unanimously J. C. Oglesby was appointed the City Engineer for the purpose of preparing the plans and specifications for the construction of shoulders to the main center section of the pavement on both sides of Sir Francis Drake Blvd. for as much as its length as is considered necessary.

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
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It was agreed that the Police Department would cooperate in the clearing of broken glass from the streets, particularly minor glass accumulations, and those instances where the breakage occurs after 5 P. M. and before 8 A. M. It will be the policy of the Police Department to clear the street of the hazard to the extend possible.

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RESOLUTION NO. 361. Upon the motion of Councilman Monte which was seconded by Councilman Smith and was adopted unanimously requesting authority of the Office of Price Administration to increase charges for garbage collection in the Town of San Anselmo.

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The attention of the City Council was called to what appears to be an abuse of the City property at the tennis courts, especially to the fact that tennis court nets are not lasting their usual life and appear to be getting a lot of abuse through improper use. The Police department agreed to cooperate in this matter.

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Upon the motion of Councilman Mason which was seconded by Councilman Smith and was adopted unanimously the Chief of Police was granted permission to leave the City during the period of his vacation.

Mr. Will Peters reported on the campaign to interest the North San Anselmo Avenune merchants in the parking lot. He indicated that the merchants heartily approved of the new parking lot which was improved by the City on the Rebecca Blumenfeld property. He further stated that a collection of over \$400.00 from the merchants to be set aside for the construction of a parking lot on the D. Ferrero property, if and when acquired by the City.

Upon the motion of Councilman Monte, which was seconded by Councilman Smith and was adopted unanimously \$150.00 was appropriated for the purpose of promoting the Third War Loan Bond drive in San Anselmo.

Upon the motion of Councilman Smith which was seconded by Councilman Linch and was adopted unanimously the Treasurer and Clerk were authorized to invest \$16,000.00 of City funds in United States bonds; it was emphasized that these funds are available in the City Treasury; due to the present war priority provisions these funds were not spent during the present and past fiscal year and should be invested in the war effort until such time as it is economically sound business to do the work for which the funds were raised.

Upon the motion of Councilman Smith which was seconded by Councilman Von Rotz and was adopted unanimously warrants No. 7852 to 7902 inclusive were approved for payment.
