MINUTES OF THE MEETING HELD JANUARY 19, 1944.

An adjourned regular meeting of the City Council was held on Wednesday January 19, 1944 at 8 o'clock P. M.

Present: Councilmen Smith, Von Rotz, Mason, Monte and Linch.

Absent: None

Mayor Linch presiding.

Mr. Raymond Williamson again appeared before the Council requesting for his clients Ryan and Drury, owners of the property at 231 Laurel Ave., that this property be rezoned so as to permit remodeling as a multiple family dwelling. As this matter had been previously considered by the Council and had been rejected, no additional facts were presented and Mr. Williamson was informed by the Mayor that the Council saw no reason to change. Numerous property owners of the neighborhood were in attendance and protested the change.

A petition was submitted to the Council requesting that appropriate action be taken against the owners of 231 Laurel Ave., alleging that the building is in a state of collapse, is a fire hazard and dangerous to the surrounding property. Lillie B. White, 219 Laurel Ave. and other petitioners being in attendance it was explained to them that this matter will be gone into in due time, but that the owners should first be given the opportunity to repair the property.

Minutes of the meeting of January 11, 1944 were read and approved.

Letter was received from J. J. Ongaro dated Jan. 18, 1944 in answer to letter from City Attorney S. W. Gardiner relative to an improper diversion of drainage waters. Mr. Ongaro believes that he is within his rights and the matter will be investigated further.

RESOLUTION NO. 369. It was regularly moved, seconded and unanimously adopted:

WHEREAS, the present conflict in the Pacific created a grave and imminent hazard to the lives and property of the residents of the Town of San Anselmo, and

WHEREAS, numerous patriotic men and women immediately volunteered their services in all branches of Civilian Defense in order to minimize the danger to life and property in the event of enemy action, and

WHEREAS, this group of citizens, comprising all the units of the San Anselmo Civilian Defense, has throughout the past two years devoted a large part of their time to training and patrol activities, and

WHEREAS, this untiring devotion to the protection of life and property by the SanAnselmo Civilian Defense has afforded a maximum of protection to, and created in the minds of, the citizens of this City a deep sense of security during this emergency,

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, by the City Council of the Town of SanAnselmo, in sincere appreciation to the members of the San Anselmo Civilian Defense ~~Defense~~ Corps, that such willing and unselfish devotion to the protective services of this City is of inestimable value and an inspiration to the war effort on the home front,

AND BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that a copy of this resolution be spread upon the official minutes of the City Council and that it be given appropriate publicity.

MINUTES OF THE MEETING HELD FEBRUARY 8, 1944.

A regular meeting of the City Council was held on Tuesday February 8, 1944 at 8 o'clock P. M.

Present: Councilman Smith, Von Rotz, Mason, Monte and Linch.

Absent: None

Mayor Linch presiding.

Mr. T. Cuthbert, representing Rose Peters, the owner of 88 Florence Ave., known as the center 80 feet of lot 41 Bush Tract. appeared before the City Council in answer to proceedings by Charles Cartwright, Building Inspector, under the "Abatement of Nuisance" Ordinance #251. He was granted until April 11, 1944, to present plans for repairs on said building.

Minutes of the meeting of January 19, 1944 were read and approved.

Letter was received from the State Department of Industrial Relations, Division of Immigration and Housing, re: 104-102 1/2 rear, Red Hill Avenue, owned by Marin County Development Co., declaring this property to be a public nuisance and unfit for human habitation. George A. Corwin, attorney for the Marin Co. Development Co. presented copies of notices "To Vacate" sent to tenants on this property.

Letter was received from the Yolansdale-Redhill Improvement Club, requesting the fire alarm box on San Anselmo Ave., opposite Fern Lane be shifted to the opposite side of the pole as it protrudes over the side-walk and is a menace to pedestrians. This box has been moved to another location. This letter also mentions the broken curbing on San Anselmo Ave. from Medway to opposite Mono Lane. This curbing will be fixed in the near future.

RESOLUTION NO. 371: Setting April 11, 1944 as date for a General Municipal Election in the Town of San Anselmo. There shall be three voting precincts at said election, which will be open between the hours of 7 A.M. and 8 P.M. Election Officials shall receive \$7.00 each as compensation for their services.
