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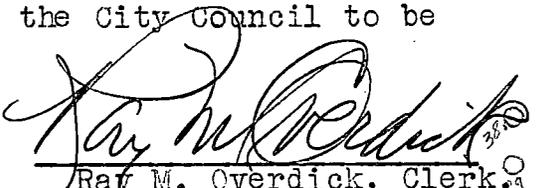

MINUTES OF THE MEETING HELD MAY 8, 1945.

A regular meeting of the City Council of the Town of San Anselmo was held in the City Hall in said Town on the 8th day of May, 1945, at eight o'clock P.M.

The report of the Building and Electrical Inspector was read and placed on file.

A letter was received from the Pacific Gas & Electric Company asking for a 60-day extension on the use of its temporary sub-station heretofore authorized. Upon motion of Councilman Love, seconded by Councilman Smith, a resolution granting said extension was voted upon and carried by the following votes:

Ayes: Councilmen Smith, Love, Kientz and von Rotz.

Not Voting: Councilman Monte.

A letter was received from the Marin County Music Chest requesting a donation for music and advertising. On motion of Councilman Monte, seconded by Councilman Smith, a motion was presented to the Council and unanimously adopted authorizing the payment of \$25.00 to the Marin Music Chest <sup>for</sup> and advertising purposes.

5-12-

Mr. Fisher, an owner of the Tivoli Hotel property, was present at the Council meeting and the problem of the old Tea Garden Building, back of the Tivoli Hotel, with relation to its being an obstruction to the free flow of storm waters during the rainy season was discussed at length. Mr. Fisher was asked whether or not he would permit the removal of said obstruction, without cost to him, and he stated that he would discuss the matter with his mother, who owns an interest in the premises, and would advise the Council at a later date.

25-30-43-

Mr. David B. Fyfe, representing Mr. A. Sckivo, requested a temporary permit for his client to alter, and repair to some extent, the Vegetable Market premises erected opposite the Tamalpais Theatre on Sir Francis Drake Boulevard. After considerable <sup>discussion</sup> of the matter, the City Clerk was instructed, by resolution of the City Council duly passed and adopted, <sup>that</sup> ~~and~~ upon payment of the proper fees to issue to Mr. Sckivo a business license to operate a market at the location requested, to and including June 30, 1945, and to issue another business license to Mr. Sckivo upon payment of the proper fees for the year commencing July 1, 1945.

The City Attorney was instructed to study the matter, and, if legal <sup>to</sup> prepare an Ordinance prohibiting the sale of merchandise and farm produce from automobiles parked in the Town of San Anselmo on locations for a period of time.

Councilman Monte discussed Assembly Bill No. 578, which is a bill prohibiting the manufacture, sale and distribution of fireworks in the State of California and is now pending before the California State Legislature. Upon motion of Councilman Monte,

seconded by Councilman Love and unanimously carrying, a resolution was adopted approving said bill and the City Clerk was directed to mail a copy of said resolution to Mr. McCollister, Assemblyman from this District.

Mr. Arthur Smith, as President of the San Anselmo Chamber of Commerce, notified the City Council that Mr. Gene Ostaggi and W. G. Peters would serve on the Committee investigating the location and installation of the drinking fountain in front of the City Hall.

The City Engineer reported that he had discussed the matter of defining the City Limits between the Town of San Anselmo and the City of San Rafael with the City Council of the City of San Rafael and that he had been advised, to ascertain if possible, the cost of a survey to take care of this problem. He stated that he would investigate and make a rough estimate of the cost of such a survey and would notify the Councils of both cities.

It was reported that the offer of Mr. Hayden Henderson of \$60.00 for 6 lots in Sequoia Park for the sum of \$60.00 was discussed. Two members of the City Council stated that they had viewed these lots and, that in their opinion, they were of no practical value as building sites. Upon motion of Councilman Smith, seconded by Councilman Love, a resolution was passed authorizing the sale of said lots to said prospective buyer in the sum of \$60.00, and authorizing the Mayor and the City Clerk to execute a Deed to the property in question.

The City Clerk announced that the Sale Contract for certain lots on Oak Avenue had been fully complied with by the Purchaser, Mr. Jack Piver, and that he had in his possession the sum of \$1,000 for the lot therein described. On motion of Councilman Kientz, seconded by Councilman Monte, a resolution was duly passed and adopted by unanimous vote setting the fair market value at \$1,000, authorizing the Mayor and the City Clerk to execute a deed to the property and further to cancel all liens and taxes now an encumbrance on said property.

The City Clerk mentioned the fact that several oil companies had consulted him with reference to the present contract with the Gilmore Oil Company, having in mind that the Gilmore had recently consolidated with General Petroleum Company. The Council felt that the contract with Gilmore would be fully complied with by General Petroleum and determined not to call

for any further contracts with the supply of gasoline to the City at this time.

ORDINANCE NO. 285 - REGULATING PARKING OF BICYCLES.

35-53-

The matter of the proposed ordinance prohibiting bicycle parking on streets and sidewalks was discussed. Mr. Tony Chausse appeared before the Council and objected to the passage of said ordinance stating that it was an unreasonable interference with the rights of the children to park on the streets and was an unnecessary ordinance. After considerable discussion, the ordinance was again read in full and as a final reading, and was adopted by unanimous vote of the Council.

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ORDINANCE NO. 284 - REGULATING SIZE OF CULVERTS.

An ordinance prohibiting the maintenance, erection or construction of culverts or other structures in or over creeks in the Town of San Anselmo, Amending Ordinance No. 263 of the Town of San Anselmo, was presented for a second reading and was read in full, and upon motion of Councilman Monte, seconded by Councilman Love, was duly adopted and passed by unanimous vote.

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The City Clerk announced that he had in his possession a Petition requesting the annexation of Sleepy Hollow Acres to the Town of San Anselmo and that he would check the names to determine whether or not sufficient qualified electors had signed the petition and would have it ready for presentation to the City Council at the next regular meeting.
