

Councilman Love, Chairman of the Street Department Committee, ⁴⁵⁻²¹⁻ addressed the Council concerning contemplated repair of San Anselmo Avenue from Pine Street to the bridge opposite San Rafael Avenue, and suggested that a letter be written to the Marin Municipal Water District requesting that they place new water mains in said street area before this work of repaving and resurfacing should commence. He further suggested that the Water District be cautioned in the future about resurfacing when making excavations through the pavement, and that the poor workmanship on the past excavations be called to the attention of said Water District. The City Clerk was directed to write such a letter. 90

Wood, as a member of a committee to discuss a taxi cab ordinance, spoke at length before the Council and made recommendations concerning a proposed taxi ordinance. MINUTES OF THE MEETING HELD NOVEMBER 27, 1945.

An adjourned regular meeting of the City Council was held on Tuesday, November 27, 1945, at 8 o'clock P.M. 350

Present: Councilmen von Rotz, Smith, Love and Monte.

Absent: Councilman Kientz.
Mayor von Rotz presiding.

Minutes of the previous meetings not already read and approved were dispensed with. 390

This being the time previously fixed for the consideration of the matter of the construction of a new swimming pool, the Mayor invited the numbers present in the Council Chambers to discuss the matter. There were about twenty-five citizens of San Anselmo present, and various people addressed the Council on the necessity and advisability of constructing and erecting a new swimming pool as a living war memorial. 450

²¹ Mrs. Jack Sward, of the Parent Teachers Associatio, Mrs. Beth Kaufman, Commander A. Seimer, and Mrs. Mary Gilkey, Harry Abraus and others, discussed the matter of the proposed

swimming pool, and after such discussion the Mayor appointed a committee to study a specific plan for a swimming pool and make a proposal as to the method of financing it. The Mayor appointed Richard Love, Chairman of this Committee, and as members appointed Mr. D. F. Monte, Mrs. Jack Sward, Ray Crist, Mrs. Jos. Meagor, and Mrs. Jas. Delaney.

Councilman Kientz took his place at the Council table at nine o'clock.

A letter was received from G. D. Vickery of the Police Department tendering his resignation as a Police Officer of the Town of San Anselmo, effective as of November 15th, 1945. Upon motion of Councilman Smith, seconded by Councilman Love a resolution was duly passed and adopted accepting the resignation of G. D. Vickery.

A proposed ordinance, amending Ordinance No. 244, of the Town of San Anselmo, adding additional offices to those covered by Civil Service regulations, was presented for first reading and was read in full.

The City Attorney advised the Council that he had talked to Mr. Kenneth Dunn with regard to his encroachment upon public streets in Hawthorne Hills in the Town of San Anselmo, and that it had been pointed out to said City Attorney that many places in Hawthorne Hills, likewise encroached upon public street areas. The City Attorney recommended that no definite action be taken at this time, but that such work of improvement as necessary be started and accomplished as desired.

On motion of Councilman Monte, seconded by Councilman Smith, it was regularly moved and adopted that A. H. Seimerr be reappointed City Engineer effective January 1, 1946, subject to the provision that John Oglesby, acting City Engineer complete the plans & specifications for those projects started or surveyed by him.

There being no further business, the meeting ended at 9:30 P.M., the next regular meeting of the City Council to be held on Tuesday, the 11th day of December, 1945.
