MINUTES OF THE MEETING HELD DECEMBER 10, 1946.

A regular meeting of the City Council was held on Tuesday, December 10, 1946 at 8 o'clock P.M.

Present: Councilmen Monte, Smith, Love, Miller and Allen.

Absent: None.  
Mayor Monte presiding.

Rezoning of A. H. Tucker property, on easterly line of Sir Francis Drake Blvd., south of Presbyterian Orphanage, a public hearing having been held by the City Planning Commission on his application to rezone from first residential to unrestricted, the report of the City Planning Commission was read in full. Upon motion of Councilman Love, seconded by Councilman Allen, it was duly passed and adopted that a public hearing be held by the City Council at their meeting on January 14, 1947.

Transfer of Certificate of Convenience and Necessity for the operation of taxi cabs, having been applied for by Harry Ridgway and Robert Sherman, who are negotiating for the

purchase of the business of the Bellucci Bros., dba Veterans' Taxi Service, and subsequent to the report of the Chief of Police that the credentials and background of the applicants appear entirely in order, upon the motion of Councilman Smith, seconded by Councilman Miller, it was duly passed and adopted that the transfer be approved.

Appontment of Gino W. Anselmi to the Rank of Sergeant in the Police Department at the established salary of \$240 per month was approved following the motion of Councilman Smith, seconded by Councilman Miller.

Purchase of 18 Raincoats and Hats for the Junior Traffic Patrol detailed to St. Anselm's School was ordered, upon the motion of Councilman Smith, seconded by Councilman Miller.

Provisions for Special Inspection Fees for construction not supervised by a licensed contractor as proposed in an ordinance and the title of same was read. Upon motion of Councilman Smith, seconded by Councilman Miller, it was duly passed that further reading be dispensed with.

Ordinance No. 297. AN ORDINANCE AMENDIN ORDINANCE NO. 924 OF THE TOWN OF SAN ANSELMO ENTITLED "AN ORDINANCE REGULATING THE ERECTION, CONSTRUCTION, ENLARGEMENT, ALTERATION, REPAIR, MOVING, REMOVAL, DEMOITION, CONVERSION, OCCUPANCY, EQUIPMENT, USE, HEIGHT, AREA, AND MAINTENANCE OF BUILDINGS AND/OR STRUCTURES IN THE TOWN OF SAN ANSELMO; PROVIDING FOR THE ISSUANCE OF PERMITS AND COLLECTIONS OF FEES THEREFOR; DECLARING AND ESTABLISHING FIRE DISTRICTS; PROVIDING PENALTIES FOR THE

VIOLATION THEREOF, AND CONFLICT THEREWITH; AND FOR THAT PURPOSE ADOPTING THE UNIFORM BUILDING CODE 1946 EDITION AS PREPARED BY PACIFIC COAST BUILDING OFFICIALS' CONFERENCE WITH CERTAIN MODIFICATIONS AND EXCEPTIONS", BY THE ADDITION THERETO OF A NEW SECTION, NUMBERED 2.5, RELATING TO SPECIAL INSPECTION FEES. Upon motion of Councilman Smith, seconded by Councilman Miller, said Ordinance was duly passed and adopted.

Closing a Portion of Sir Francis Drake Blvd., to establish the street line at the old Latham Tract and pursuant to the request of the Lang Realty; the publication and posting of the property having run the required time, upon the motion of Councilman Love, seconded by Councilman Smith, it was duly passed and adopted that the meeting of January 14, 1947 be set as the date for final hearing.

Spaulding Tract Streets; Upon the motion of Councilman Miller, seconded by Councilman Love, it was duly passed and adopted that the Mayor and the City Clerk be authorized to execute a quit claim deed to Lang Realty pursuant to the street abandonment and closing proceedings recently authorized.

Garbage Disposal was the subject of discussion, particularly that portion of the ordinance which requires that every household avail themselves of the services provided. It was decided to thoroughly investigate the provisions of the ordinance and to iron out any inequalities. For this purpose the Mayor appointed a committee of R. E. Love, Arthur W. Smith, Donald T. Wood and himself.

Warrants #9785 to #9844 inclusive were ordered paid on the motion of Councilman Allen, seconded by Councilman Love.

Resolution No. Suit to condemn for Fire Engine House a portion of the property owned by Mac Cormack Tucker Lumber Co., situated on the easterly line of Sir Francis Drake Blvd., southerly and adjacent to the old cemetery road south of the Orphanage. Upon motion of Councilman Love, seconded by Councilman Allen, said resolution was duly passed and adopted and the City Attorney was instructed to proceed.

Railroad Avenue Traffic Control was further discussed after the reading of a letter of December 2nd from R. J. Zanzot and others.


Pierce Construction on San Francisco Blvd., Sir Francis Drake
