12 RICHARD MC LAREN appointed to Department of Fire at the salary ³⁸⁻¹⁷ of \$225.00 effective April 15, 1947, upon the motion of Councilman Love, seconded by Councilman Allen.



27 BROOK LANE, MORNINGSIDE COURT 1 & 2 legal status was discussed ⁴⁵⁻¹² by City Attorney Wallace S. Myers, who advised that in his opinion said parcel had never been accepted by the City.

MINUTES OF THE MEETING HELD MAY 27, 1947.

MINUTES OF THE REGULAR MEETING OF MAY 13, 1947 ³⁰⁻⁴¹ were read and approved.

PETITION TO REVOKE TAXI CERTIFICATE issued to Eugene & Lone

49 Wilson, dba Dan's Taxi; this matter was heard by the Council in accord with the previous notice. After considerable discussion, all parties being represented, and on advice of the City Attorney that there appeared to have been sub-

stantial compliance with the provisions of the ordinance appertaining to the hours that Dan's Taxi was available for service calls in San Anselmo, and upon the motion of Councilman Miller, seconded by Councilman Allen, it was duly passed and adopted that the petition to revoke ^{the permit} be dismissed. This action was taken after assurance by Mr. Wilson that a car will be stationed here during the hours as provided in Ordinance #290.

PROVIDING ADDITIONAL AREA FOR SECOND RESIDENTIAL ZONING was proposed by Mr. D. D. Johnson on the 4½ acre tract owned by him adjoining the Monterey Tract development. After considerable discussion the Mayor advised Mr. Johnson that he should go forward with the required petition to rezone the area from first residential as provided by the zoning ordinances.

VETERANS MEMORIAL PARK proposed by Leo Schutz, Commander, San Anselmo Post, American Legion as the name for the Recreation Park area and that the ^{area} ~~same~~ should be developed at the earliest possible time. It was suggested by the Mayor that the Legion confer with Councilman Love, who is working on the problem of a suitable memorial, and with a similar committee for the Veterans of Foreign Wars.

ORDINANCE #299-An ordinance amending Ordinance #254 of the Town of San Anselmo entitled "An Ordinance Regulating and Establishing the Location of Trades, Industries, Businesses and Dwellings in the Town of San Anselmo, and the Locations of Buildings Designed for Specific Uses, Establishing Districts or Zones and the Boundaries Thereof for said Purposes, and Providing Penalties for the Violation of this Ordinance" by the addition thereto of a new section numbered 8:1 was presented for a second reading (having been read first April 8, 1947) and was read in full. Upon the motion of Councilman Smith, seconded by Councilman Miller, said ordinance was duly passed and adopted.

LOTS 9 and 10, resub of lots 161A to 166 Bush Tract, upon the motion of Councilman Smith, seconded by Councilman Miller, it was duly passed and adopted that the fair market value on this property be set at \$400.00, that the Mayor and

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the Clerk be authorized to execute a deed to William D. Abbey, he having been the highest bidder at a public sale held May 24th, 1947, and that the Tax Collector be authorized to cancel all tax and special assessment liens against said property.

IMPROVEMENTS RECREATION PARK were ordered, upon the motion of Councilman Smith, seconded by Councilman Allen, by way of changing the course of the creek now crossing the area to approximately the edge of the park and providing the funds therefore to a sum not exceeding \$995.00.

FOUR STREET LIGHTS IN HILLDALE PARK were ordered installed upon the motion of Councilman Miller, seconded by Councilman Smith, and unanously adopted.

PEDESTRIAN CROSS WALK AT REDHILL AND SEQUOIA DRIVE to be indicated by painted lines on the pavement was ordered, due to the extremely heavy traffic at that point.

DISCUSSION ON PROVISIONS OF GARBAGE ORDINANCE, in which it appeared to the protestants present that the ordinance was unfair in the provisions relating to extra trips for refuse disposal, such as brush or garden clippings, such hauling to be done by the authorized garbage disposal agent only, and also in the regulation that every occupied dwelling place shall be required to have garbage service. The Mayor stated his opinions as to the reasons for this ordinance but concluded that the ordinance will be studied with the City Attorney and Health Authorities within the attempt to provide an ordinance not subject to these objections but still effective in the aim to prevent unauthorized disposal.

ACCUMULATION OF DRY BRUSH in wooded areas near Forest Avenue was the subject of a complaint from Mrs. Robert Murgatroyd. Fire Chief Marcucci was requested to investigate.

CITY PLANNING COMMISSION MINUTES OF MEETING OF MAY 15, 1947 were read.
