MINUTES OF THE ADJOURNED MEETING OF MAY 25, 1948, were read

and it was reported by the City Engineer that he had gone as far on the study of widening certain sections of Upper Scenic Avenue as he believed himself authorized to go and without further instructions he deemed his assignment was completed. No further action was taken. Subject to this correction the minutes were approved.

JAMES A. FARMER APPOINTED SPECIAL POLICE OFFICER and removed

from the list of Reserves, upon the motion of Councilman Booth, seconded by Councilman Love. This action was taken that Mr. Farmer could be paid for any special police duty assignments. *39-38*

36 FERN LANE, BROKEN CURB, GUTTER AND SIDEWALK to be repaired

or replaced on 50% cooperative basis with Sanitary District #1, upon the motion of Councilman Love, seconded by Councilman Booth. *45-46*

approved, objected to in letter by Ray Bocarde, 42 Rutherford Avenue. The City Attorney advised that, in his opinion, the adjustment was legally in order and the City Clerk <sup>was</sup> instructed to so advise Mr. Bocarde. *56-25*

following the motion of Councilman Booth, seconded by Councilman Love, in which they also expressed their appreciation for the civic services of the above appointees. *9-31-7*

absence of Councilman Allen.

"STOP FOR PEDESTRIAN" PORTABLE SIGN requested by Myles Tobin,

chairman, Civic Affairs Committee, Hilldale Park. Police Chief Wood advised that such a sign would be impractical at this location and it was decided to see how the pedestrian cross walks painted on pavement worked out. *39-53*

USE OF BALL PARK REQUESTED BY D.J. BOCCABELLA for Marin

County Team was referred to Councilman Miller and the City Clerk to work out a schedule. 40-9

BUILDING INSPECTORS REPORT FOR MAY 48 was received.LETTER RECEIVED FROM 14 MEMBERS OF POLICE RESERVES in which

they took exception to previous action of the Council in the matter of leaving their stars at the station while not in use, and also that there will be no further compensation for their services. 38-39
