SUIT OF OTTO BORTFELD for reinstatement as a regular Police Officer was discussed and he was instructed to resist this action, following the motion of Councilman Love, seconded by Councilman Allen and passing by the following vote:



ROSEMONT AVENUE-Bad slides from private property during recent heavy rains, completely blocked off street and other

damage. It was alleged that this accident may have been caused by excavation and dirt moving on private property. The City Attorney and the City Engineer were instructed to investigate this instance and to confer on a proposed ordinance to regulate all excavations or dirt moving on private property.

MONTEREY TRACT-Letter received from Edwina (Mrs. Daniel L.)

Costello of 24 Monterey Avenue, dated March 13, 1949, in which she alleges improper drainage of private property and improper excavations on same, that the recent rains have caused slides and uprooted trees from one private property to another causing extensive damage.

CORNER OF PASADENA AND SANTA BARBARA AVENUES, Owner Chas. P. Drolla

of lot 336 Short Ranch Sub 2, complains of the improper size culvert which crossed his property. It was indicated that the City Engineer had inspected this property at the time of installation and had requested a bond from Columbus Pierce the owner of the property at that time to insure the City against any subsequent damage which may result, said bond being subsequently filed with the City.

STREET TREE REMOVAL REQUEST BY OWNER EMMA DANIELS at corner of

Jones Street and Ross Avenue was presented by Councilman Booth and said request was unanimously refused. Request for appropriate trimming had been previously allowed.

Joint Pacific Gas and Electric & Pacific Telephone and Telegraph pole on Magnolia at San Anselmo Avenue, previously reported as


being unsafe, to be reported to said companies again.

Said resolution was duly adopted following the motion of Councilman Booth, seconded by Councilman Miller.
