Moved by Councilman O'Mara and seconded by Councilman Smith that the candlepower on the light at the Brookmead Court entrance be<sup>50</sup> increased, and that an additional pole be set on the east side of Butterfield Rd. and install 10100cp on said pole at about the footbridge entrance to the school


