

2 MINUTES OF THE ADJOURNED REGULAR MEETING HELD APRIL 24, 1951

4 An adjourned regular meeting of the San Anselmo City Council was held  
5 at the City Hall, Tuesday, April 24, 1951 at 8:00 P.M.

6 Present: Councilmen: Skinner, Knoles, O'Mara, Smith, Booth

9 Mayor Booth presiding.

10 MINUTES OF THE MEETING HELD APRIL 10, 1951 READ AND APPROVED WITH THE  
11 CHANGE that the estimate of cost of paving on San Francisco Blvd. was  
12 for the shoulders only from San Diego Ave. to the City Limits.

13  
14 APPOINTMENTS CIVIL SERVICE BOARD OF REVIEW:

15 Robert Paganini appointed to replace Mario Paganini and Jerry Hannigan  
16 appointed to replace Joseph Crean on the motion of Councilman O'Mara  
17 and seconded by Councilman Knoles as members of the San Anselmo Civil  
18 Service Board of Review.

19  
20 RADIO COMMUNICATION EQUIPMENT FOR RESCUE TRUCK. J. Mansfield Lewis,  
21 County Radio Technician appeared before the council and explained  
22 that he had conferred with the Fire Chief relative to the matter of in-  
23 stallng radio equipment in the rescue truck, and since this truck, be-  
24 ing the only one of its kind in the county, would be used for rescue  
25 work wherever needed in the county in the event of a disaster, the  
26 County of Marin has informally given favorable consideration to the  
27 purchase of the major portion of the necessary equipment if the Town  
28 of San Anselmo would be willing to also purchase a portion. Cost to the  
29 County of Marin would be approximately \$435 and \$225 to the Town of  
30 San Anselmo plus tax. Moved by Councilman O'Mara and seconded by  
31 Councilman Knoles that the purchase of said radio equipment be approved  
32 subject to the approval of the Board of Supervisors to purchase the  
33 portion of the equipment as explained by Mr. Lewis.

39 PUBLIC HEARING ON REZONING FROM FIRST RESIDENTIAL TO COMMERCIAL ZONING  
40 LOT 11 BLOCK 2 SEQUOIA PARK, KNOWN AS 210 REDHILL AVE.

41 Attorney Raymond Shone represented the petitioners. Mr. F.L. Jones,  
42 resident of Parkway objected to the rezoning on the assumption that  
43 commercial traffic will then come into the residential zone and cause  
44 undue hazards, plus the additional hazard with parking on Redhill. Chief  
45 Wood stated that he did not believe the traffic problem would be any  
46 greater here than any other location on Redhill Avenue. Matter put  
47 over to May 8, 1951 to allow Councilman O'Mara to acquaint himself with  
48 the terrain of the property sought to be rezoned.

PROPOSED ORDINANCE AMENDING ORDINANCE 318, DOG CONTROL ORDINANCE READ IN FULL FOR FIRST READING. This would regulate pound fees of \$.25 per day for care of impounded animals and a \$2.00 impounding fee.

CITY COUNCIL INVITED BY SAN ANSELMO MERCHANTS TEAM TO BE PRESENT AT FIRST GAME OF THE 1951 SEASON TO BE HELD AT THE SAN ANSELMO PARK ON APRIL 29, 1951. Clerk to acknowledge and accept.

MARIN MUSIC CHEST REQUEST FOR FUNDS. Clerk to acknowledge and advise that no funds are available at this time.

PURCHASE OF ROYAL TYPEWRITER FOR OFFICE OF CITY CLERK AUTHORIZED ON THE MOTION OF COUNCILMAN SMITH AND SECONDED BY COUNCILMAN SKINNER.

To be purchased from Ray's Office Machinery at a cost of \$155. plus tax.

WARRANTS 2804-2805 INCL. APPROVED AND ORDERED PAID ON THE MOTION OF COUNCILMAN O'MARA AND SECONDED BY COUNCILMAN SMITH.

RESIGNATION OF RAY M. OVERDICK, CITY CLERK, ASSESSOR AND COMPTROLLER TO BE EFFECTIVE ON OR ABOUT JULY 1, 1951 ACCEPTED. Recommended by Mr. Overdick that with the addition of another office clerk, the present personnel should be able to carry on until such time as a new City Clerk has been elected.

ANNE M. GRANT RE-CLASSIFIED TO CLASSIFICATION 19 RANGE E EFFECTIVE MAY 1, 1951 on the motion of Councilman Smith and seconded by Councilman O'Mara.

IRMA B. ANDERSON RE-CLASSIFIED TO CLASSIFICATION 9 RANGE D EFFECTIVE MAY 1, 1951 on the motion of Councilman Smith and seconded by Councilman Skinner

JUNK BOTTLE BUSINESS COMPLAINT AT LAVARONI PROPERTY ON SAN ANSELMO AVE. & REDWOOD ROAD.

Councilman Knoles reported that the Lavaroni Bros will clean up the area and fence it in.

TRAFFIC REGULATION - SIR FRANCIS DRAKE BLVD. OPPOSITE SUPER SERVICE STATION AT SPAULDING AVENUE.

Councilman Knoles reported on the traffic survey of the City Council members and Mary Gilkey of the City Planning Commission. Suggested by Chief Wood that a thirty foot opening could be established to allow left turns by eastbound traffic off S.F. Drake Blvd. into the Super Service Station. It was then moved by Councilman O'Mara and seconded by Councilman Knoles that a physical barrier be placed from Bridge Avenue to Spaulding St. leaving a thirty foot opening for left turn off S.F. Drake Blvd. Defeated on the following vote:

- Ayes: Councilmen: Knoles and O'Mara
- Noes: Councilmen: Skinner, Smith, and Booth

It was then moved by Councilman O'Mara and seconded by Councilman Skinner to erect a physical barrier of concrete from Bridge Avenue to Spaulding Ave. which would prohibit left turns of S.F. Drake at this point. Adopted on the following vote:

- Ayes: Councilmen: Skinner, O'Mara, Smith and Booth
- Noes: Councilmen: Knoles

6 STREET COMMITTEE REPORT:

7 Street sign for Hillcrest and Laurel Ave. to be considered in the budget  
8 for the next fiscal year.

9 ELECTROLIERS # 2713, 2714, 2727, 2728, 2729, 2726, & 2733 in the vicinity of  
10 Morningside Court #1 and S.F. Drake Blvd. increased from 100 cp. to 250  
11 candlepower on the motion of Councilman Knoles and seconded by Councilman  
12 O'Mara.

15 RECREATION COMMITTEE REPORT: Councilman Skinner reported that the school  
16 district is making plans for the administration of the summer program  
17 and he feels that this year the city will enjoy a very fine program.

19 POLICE AND FIRE REPORT:

20 Councilman O'Mara reported that the new police cars have been deliver-  
21 ed and are being put into service by the Police Dept.

22 Purchase of tires for the rescue truck approved and to be purchased from  
23 Perry and Whitelaw in San Francisco at a cost of \$123.84 less excise tax  
24 and allowance for the old tires on the motion of Councilman O'Mara and  
25 seconded by Councilman Knoles.

29 POLICE CHIEF'S REPORT:


30 Recommends the adoption of the uniform curfew law to be adopted by the  
31 County of Marin and that Senator McCarthy be asked to support Senate  
32 Bill #1433 establishing curfew. Moved by Councilman Skinner and seconded  
33 by Councilman O'Mara that the clerk so telegram Senator McCarthy relative  
34 to Senate Bill #1433. Asks that the Council express their willingness  
35 to have a county bicycle registration. Council expressed their willing-  
36 ness. Recommended that an ordinance be drafted regulating the length  
37 of driveways not to exceed thirty feet for commercial use, with a limit  
38 of two such driveways to a business. Chief of Police, Fire Chief, and the  
39 City Attorney to confer relative to drafting a proposed ordinance regu-  
40 lating the length of driveways.

46 City Clerk Overdick reported the sign in need of paint. Referred to
