REQUEST FOR LEASE OF CITY-OWNED PROPERTY FOR PURPOSE OF CONSTRUCTION OF A RESERVE ELECTRONICS FACILITY RECEIVED FROM DISTRICT PUBLIC WORKS OFFICE OF THE TWELFTH NAVAL DISTRICT.

Proposal favorably considered by the City Council and moved by Councilman O'Mara and seconded by Councilman Smith that the council go on record as being in favor of leasing the property and allowing the construction of the electronics training facility. RESOLUTION # 547 CREATING AND ESTABLISHING A JUVENILE DIVISION IN THE DEPARTMENT OF POLICE OF THE TOWN OF SAN ANSELMO ADOPTED ON THE MOTION OF COUNCILMAN O'MARA AND SECONDED BY COUNCILMAN SMITH. Mayor Booth commended Chief Wood for the fine work the Police Dept. has done in Juvenile Matters in the past month and the noted decline in the number of juvenile cases. Chief Wood announced that on Dec. 28th Capt. Meehan of the San Francisco Police Dept. Juvenile Div. would speak at Star Hall and asked that the speech be given publicity so that interested adults be invited to attend. Copies of Resolution to be sent to Mrs. Dorothy Miller of Upper Crescent Dr. in Sausalito and various other agencies connected with juvenile matters in the state.

ORGANIZATION AND POWERS TO ADMINISTER FUNDS BY NEWLY FORMED RECREATION COMMITTEE DISCUSSED. Mayor Booth advised that she felt that the committee should have a freehand in the planning of the summer program on the same basis as last year, but that monies in excess of that allotted by the city for summer program should be passed upon by the city council.

STREET COMMITTEE REPORT:

Councilman Cohn reported that the sidewalk at the S.F. Drake High School is below the crown of the street and that until the proper curb lines have been established the school has installed a temporary sidewalk of macadam, which is actually in violation of the sidewalk ordinance, however he has been assured by Mr. Van Dyke that the board will give in writing to the city council evidence that they will remove or replace this sidewalk of macadam with the proper cement walk, when the proper lines have been established.

RECREATION COMMITTEE REPORT:

Councilman Skinner reported that arrangements have been made for various choral groups to sing at the city hall during the week preceding Christmas. Members of the new Recreation Committee named as follows: Mrs. Claire Bailey, Robt. Currie, Chester Carlisle, Lillburn Erb, and Jack Skinner.

POLICE AND FIRE COMMITTEE REPORT:

Police Party for Traffic Boys and parents to be held at Star Hall on December 27th, 1951. Council members invited. \$75.00 authorized for expenses.

WARRANTS 3240-3302 APPROVED AND ORDERED PAID ON THE MOTION OF COUNCILMAN SMITH AND SECONDED BY COUNCILMAN SKINNER.

CITY ENGINEER'S REPORT:

Reported that the drainage in Morningside Court Sub.3 has not yet been satisfactorily corrected.

Permission granted City Engineer to address letter to Columbus Pierce making additional requirements before formal acceptance of his Sleepy Hollow Addition Subdivision on the motion of Councilman Cohn and seconded by Councilman O'Mara.

DRAINAGE COMPLAINT RECEIVED FROM MR. ROBINSON, 35 Morningside Dr.

Councilman Cohn to investigate.

POLICE CHIEF'S REPORT. Reported that sidewalk area at Loftus Bros. garage has been paved with asphalt to the edge of the curb and that parked cars in the sidewalk area cause people to have to walk on the street area, which is hazardous. City Attorney to speak to R. McLaren relative to this matter.

LURID MAGAZINES ON LOCAL NEWSTANDS COMPLAINED OF BY COUNCILMAN SKINNER.

Councilman Skinner asked that action be taken by the council to address the local newstands and request that they remove certain magazines designed for their sensational immoral appeal. Matter discussed by various council members who then asked that the matter be referred to the Police Chief in the form of a list of the alleged indecent magazines, that the matter be referred to the District Attorney for further investigation.

CITY ATTORNEY'S REPORT:

Reported on request from San Rafael Land Title Co. that the city abandon an easement on Lots 82 and 85 of Morningside Court Sub. 2. Moved by councilman O'Mara and seconded by Councilman Smith that the City Attorney proceed with the drafting of abandonment proceedings.

Reported that he has reviewed the matter of the Asst. Fire Chief's Salary, and feels that the duties of inspecting alarm boxes are included in the duties of Asst. Chief, and that if he is acting as assistant building inspector it is without council authorization and should not be compensated for such duties without authorization of the council. Recommends that salary of Asst. Chief, remain as set forth in recent Resolution²³⁴⁵ adjusting pay of city employees.
