Low bid of Dohemann Motors to supply 1952 Customline Ford Four Door Sedans at a cost of \$551.71 each accepted on the motion of Councilman O'Mara and seconded by Councilman Cohn. Heavy duty springs, shocks and brakes to be added and additional depreciation to automobiles at \$1.50 per day with a limit of \$22.50 if cars are not delivered by

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42 March 15th also authorized by same motion. Certain other police equipment will be transferred to the new cars.

CIVILIAN DEFENSE REPORT:

Mr. Walter Langford reported on the results of the air raid test and said that results on the whole were very gratifying and that the citizens were most cooperative. Purchase of new siren from County of Marin for approximately \$100. authorized on the motion of Councilman O'Mara and seconded by Councilman Smith. Clerk to advise Mr. Englehart that this city is interested in making such a purchase.

MRS. CREBASSA PROTESTED POLICE CALL IN REGARD TO PARTY OR OPEN HOUSE BEING HELD AT HER HOME FOR TEEN-AGERS AFTER RECENT BASKETBALL GAME. Mayor Booth said she personally felt that the good Mrs. Crebassa was doing for the youth of the community far offset the discomfort any neighbor might be caused by loud voices, and that before police took action in the future a formal citizen's complaint should be filed with the court. Requested that the reporter present from the Independent-Journal give this matter publicity.

MIRACLE MILE IMPROVEMENT. City Attorney Buresh suggested that the City Council proceed with the planning for improvement of the Miracle Mile, AND Councilman Cohn was appointed to serve as a representative from this city on the City-County road planning committee.

COUNCILMAN COHN-STREET COMMITTEE REPORT:

Reported that trees on Tamalpais Avenue adjacent to the Ferrari Stationery Store have been removed and that the owners asked if it would be possible to cut curb back to existing sidewalk and thus widen street at that point

to facilitate truck parking. Considered by the council that street should remain as it is presently.

RECREATION COMMITTEE REPORT:

Councilman Skinner suggested that a community agreement be drawn up between the School Board and the Town pledging themselves to work together on recreation plans on a year to year contract basis. City Attorney to take this matter up with the School Board's Attorney.

Moved by Councilman Skinner and seconded by Councilman Smith that the City appropriate \$2000 for the 1952 Recreation Program for the Summer months and the board be allowed to hire Mr. Diamond as Director.

PURCHASE OF 1948 PLYMOUTH SEDAN AT A COST OF \$1050 FOR USE OF POLICE

INSPECTOR AUTHORIZED on the motion of Councilman O'Mara and seconded by Councilman Smith. Motion passed unanimously.

TREE TRIMMING IN BARBER TRACT. Mr. Sohner advised that he has been tree trimming in the Barber Tract at the expense of the P.G. & E. Co. in order to clear power lines, and had received objection for trimming tree near 139 Barber Avenue. Councilman Cohn to investigate and advise Mr. Sohner.

OF SAN ANSELMO ON the motion of Councilman O'Mara and seconded by Councilman Cohn. Motion passed unanimously.


