

MINUTES OF THE REGULAR MEETING OF THE SAN ANSELMO CITY COUNCIL HELD FEBRUARY 13, 1962

PRESENT COUNCILMEN: ROUSE, SMITH, FRANCHINI, REICHMUTH, LITTLE
Mayor Little, presiding

Councilman Rouse stated he had been released from hospital and his doctor advised him he could continue on council and with the approval of the rest of council he would continue as councilman. Councilman Reichmuth moves verbal resignation of Councilman Rouse be rejected. Councilman Smith seconds same. Passed unanimously

Councilman Reichmuth moves approval to minutes of January 9th and 23rd. Councilman Smith seconds same. Passed unanimously

ORDINANCE NO. 478 "An ordinance amending the Municipal Code of the City of San Anselmo by adding Chapter 6 to Title 5 thereof, regulating food handling in the City of San Anselmo. Read in full

JAMES KILTY, 60 Essex Avenue, addressed council on pedestrian crossing at Hub intersection. Mr. Kilty asked that council give serious consideration to electric signal at Essex & Redhill. City Administrator, City Engineer and Chief of Police to make study of pedestrian crossing.

AGREEMENT relating to the assessment and collection of Municipal Taxes of the City of San Anselmo by the County Assessor and County Tax Collector. Councilman Smith moves Mayor and City Clerk to execute agreement. Councilman Reichmuth seconds same. Motion passed on following vote:

AYES COUNCILMEN: Rouse, Smith, Reichmuth, Little
NOES COUNCILMAN: Franchini

TOWN CENTER LIGHTS City Administrator reported on lights and on recommendation made by Dr. Finch suggests the following:

29 luminaires with ballasts
29 davit poles

total cost \$6,886.75. Award lights to Westinghouse and poles to Pacific Union Metal also recommending steel poles.

Councilman Rouse moves to accept recommendation of City Administrator cost as above plus sales tax. Councilman Smith seconds same. Passed unanimously
Councilman Rouse suggests City Administrator look into lighting plan for City Hall.

Councilman Rouse moves approval to appropriation from General Fund \$6,886.75 plus tax -Total \$7,162.22. Councilman Smith seconds same. Passed unanimously

JAMES BULKLEY letter on Anti-Communism read and ordered filed.

Proclamation proclaiming week of February 11th-17th as "National Beauty Salon Week". Councilman Rouse moves to refuse request. Councilman Franchini seconds same. Passed unanimously

Mayor Little reported on questionnaire with suggestion name be changed from Marin County Mayors Conference to "The Marin County Conference of Cities". Also No. 3 question - Membership consist of Mayors and Councilmen.

No. 4 - voting and quorum requirements -each city shall have one vote. Councilmen approved change and also No. 3 question, but felt No. 4 should be individual vote by Mayor and councilmen. City Attorney spoke on same and City Administrator suggested Mayor take City Attorney to next meeting.

CLAIMS AND DEMANDS, ^{Resol # 298} in the amount of \$66,412.41 for January 1962. Councilman Rouse moves approval. Councilman Reichmuth seconds same. Passed unanimously

City Attorney reported he will have solicitors ordinance ready for next meeting.

Councilman Smith spoke on complaints on drainage problems and feels council should make plans to take care of same. Mayor instructed City Administrator to come up with something in next budget. Councilman Rouse suggests City Engineer to make study and report back on March 27th.

Councilman Rouse spoke on matter of office of Mayor being elective, matter discussed and Councilman Rouse stated he would drop same for present.

City Administrator reported both citizen committees are making progress. Councilman Rouse spoke on landscaping day inviting citizens to help in landscaping and planting.
