

Minutes of the regular meeting of the San Anselmo City Council held February 26, 1963
 PRESENT COUNCILMEN: Clute, Smith, Franchini, Capurro, Reichmuth
 Mayor Reichmuth, presiding

Councilman Capurro moves approval to minutes of January 8th and 23rd. Councilman Smith seconds same. Passed unanimously

PUBLIC HEARING

This was date for public hearing on the adoption of the 1962 National Electrical Code. As no one was present to speak against same public hearing was closed. City Attorney presented copy of the City of Modesto Code and referred same to City Administrator and City Engineer for further study.

Mr. George Henderson and Mr. Leonard Robinson representing P.G. & E. spoke to council on lighting failure during storm in the downtown area. It was their opinion much of the cause was due to trees blowing down and emphasized the need for keeping trees trimmed especially trees on Tamalpais Avenue. Mayor Reichmuth thanked these men and stated City will make a survey of trees in downtown area.

SCHOOL CROSSING

Report on school crossings - City Administrator reported all crosswalks necessary had been painted - letter from Chief of Police stating school safety patrol have been contemplated at Wade Thomas School, sum in the amount of \$102.55 is needed to properly uniform this patrol. Brookside School is already organized. Estimate presented by City Engineer for pedestrian crosswalk signal at San Anselmo and Ross Avenues in the amount of \$1000.00. Councilman Franchini moves to call for bids for signals. Councilman Smith seconds same. Passed unanimously

FIRE CHIEF'S EXAMINATION

Resolution 244 "Calling a departmental promotional limited examination for an eligible list in the Fire Department in the classified service of the City of San Anselmo as provided for in Ordinance 244 of the City of San Anselmo. Councilman Franchini moves adoption. Councilman Smith seconds same. Passed unanimously

STREET LIGHTS:

C. Harper requesting a street light on Forbes Avenue. Councilman Franchini moves to deny request. Councilman Capurro seconds same. Passed unanimously

T. O'Leary requesting street light on Sir Francis Drake & San Anselmo Avenue. City Administrator reported on some electroliers in this area that have been out of service for sometime and same should be removed. Councilman Franchini moves to authorize City Administrator to have same removed. Councilman Smith seconds same. Passed unanimously.

Thomas Marshall requesting street light on Island Drive. Matter put over for next meeting. City Administrator to check further.

Ellen A. Webster, 125 Suffield Avenue letter regarding a section of city drain culvert running through her property which collapsed during storm in January. City Administrator asked council's permission to have further investigation made of this by City Engineer.

Wallace Myers letter asking renewal of garbage contract of Vic Vallergera for another 10 years - Mayor suggested a meeting between Council, Mr. Myers and Mr. Vallergera and asked City Administrator to arrange same.

Councilman Franchini moves to authorize Mayor Reichmuth to sign contract between City and owners of Safeway, Cheda Bldg., and Scott Hall at Seminary for use as fallout shelters.

Recommendation from Planning Commission regarding Use Permit Fees referred to City Administrator.

Recommendation from Planning Commission approving request of Gordon Hughes to remove approximately 24 feet of curb in front of his property at 28 Ridge Road. Councilman Smith moves approval be granted. Councilman Franchini seconds same. Passed unanimously

Resignation of Thomas Pring as a member of the Planning Commission read and accepted. Mayor asked members of council to suggest names to him for filling this vacancy

Councilman Franchini moves to call for bids for the purchase of 3 new police cars. Councilman Capurro seconds same. Passed unanimously

City Attorney reported he will meet with appraisers on Greyhound property - City Engineer to have a survey made of same.

Mayor Reichmuth recommends Mrs. Brooks Pringle as a member of the Recreation Commission

Councilman Clute moves approval to above appointment. Councilman Smith seconds same. Passed unanimously

City Administrator reported Humane Society have been cooperating with City on stray dogs around town and he has been meeting with members on this matter.

Councilman Capurro asked about hydrant at Wilshire Station and trouble pedestrians have crossing Sir Francis Drake at Bridge.

Chief of Police informed him hydrant was there permanently.

Also "Stop for Pedestrian Sign" is in order for this area.

Also reported several buttons are missing on markers on Center Blvd. that should be replaced.
