

Minutes of the regular meeting of the San Anselmo City Council held April 23, 1963.

Present Councilmen: Clute, Smith, Capurro, Reichmuth  
Absent Councilman: Franchini

Mayor Reichmuth, presiding

Matter of rezoning of San Anselmo Avenue between Center and Oak Knoll. The Planning Commission referred this matter back to council and it was their decision that the recommendation previously made by the commission to remain. Councilman Clute stated he feels the two lots at Florence & San Anselmo Ave should be rezoned Commercial as requested by the owners and balance to remain R-3. Mayor Reichmuth moves to uphold the decision of the Planning Commission. Motion failed for want of second.

City Attorney recommends to send same back to planning commission and people be advised.

Councilman Smith moves to accept recommendation of Planning Commission with the exception of parcels 7-014-21 & 22 (Tucker & Savel owners) and these two parcels remain Commercial. Councilman Capurro seconds same. Motion passed on following vote:

Councilman Capurro moves to accept low bid of Ghilotti Bros. \$695.00

Councilman Smith seconds same. Passed unanimously

Resolution No. 952 "Calling examination for eligible list for the position of Police Officer in the classified service of the City of San Anselmo, as provided for in ordinance #244 of the City of San Anselmo.

Councilman Smith moves adoption of above resolution. Councilman Clute seconds same. Passed unanimously

Councilman Clute moves approval to the appointment of Robert L. Bolick as Assistant Engineer. Councilman Reichmuth seconds same. Passed unanimously

Councilman Smith moves on recommendation of City Engineer, Island Drive be accepted for maintenance. Councilman Clute seconds same. Passed unan.

Letter from John Di Marchi, Nokomis Avenue regarding city crew crossing his front lawn for entrance to creek. Memorandum from City Engineer stating this is a right of way reserved in 1941 by the City for access to the creek, and recommending to council they deny Mr. DiMarchi's request to have crew follow another route to creek. Councilman Smith moves to deny request. Councilman Clute seconds same. Passed unanimously. City Administrator to write letter on above.

Letter from Marin County Sheriff and signed by all Police Chief's that council consider establishing equal pay for Patrolmen, Deputy Sheriffs and Police Sergeants throughout Marin County. City Administrator stated same is coming up at Mayor's meeting. Councilman Smith moves to approve in principal above request. Councilman Clute seconds same. Passed unanimously

Proclamation proclaiming May 12 through 18th as National Police Week. Mayor to sign.

Marin Art & Garden Fair letter asking council's permission to use the old railroad right of way for parking between July 3 through July 7th. Approval granted by council.

Mayor Reichmuth recommends the following names to fill vacancies on Planning Commission  
Warren Perry, 15 Barber Ave.  
James Murphy, 13 Bay Tree Lane

Councilman Clute moves approval of the appointment of Warren Perry. Councilman Smith seconds same. Passed unanimously

Councilman Clute moves approval of the appointment of James Murphy. Councilman Smith seconds same. Passed unanimously

Final Map S-25, Jack Longson owner located on Crescent Road. *Resol # 950*  
Councilman Clute moves approval of same. Councilman Smith seconds. Passed unan.

Councilman Clute brought up the matter of roads and highways and condition of same and would like to get together with Fairfax and San Rafael for discussion on this matter.

City Administrator stated he and Mr. Clute had made a trip over to the Division of Highways and as yet they have no further information. San Rafael Mayor thought this matter should start with the Engineers.

Councilman Clute feels we should write Fairfax and San Rafael councils suggesting we are interested and what suggestions they might have.

Councilman Smith suggests each city appoint a committee to follow up on same.

Mayor suggested City Engineer and City Administrator to keep council informed.

Councilman Capurro spoke on need for road work on the Miracle Mile. City Administrator feels should take money that is set aside for signals at Sequoia and use for work on Miracle Mile.
