Mayor Ragan opened meeting with statement giving back-ground of Traffic Circulation Study Plans and reason for calling this meeting. Mayor asked members of council before reaching any decision to ask himself if he is doing best for all people. Mayor then asked City Engineer to address audience and explain purpose of change from Stage 1 previously approved by Council to Stage 2 of Hub Interim Imp. Plan, inasmuch as the proposed widening of Sir Francis Drake had been abandoned. City Engineer presented plans and explained changes for the Hub intersection. Total cost of project would be \$103,000.

Following lengthy discussion motions were made.

M/S Councilman Reed-Anderson, City Council adopt Imp. Plan Stage 2 for Hub intersection prepared by Peat, Marwick & Livingston, 12/12/68 Project 4743 and request City Engineer to instruct the Traffic Planners to revise plans for intersection to handle traffic without the completion of the proposed bridge structure at Center & Bridge. Motion passed on following vote:

M/S Councilman Reed, City Council instruct City Engineer to proceed with changing the designation for Federal Aid Secondary and Urban Thoroughfare from Sir Francis Drake between Hub Intersection and Fairfax to Center Blvd., between Hub and Fairfax. Motion failed for want of second.

M/S Councilman Reed-Anderson to instruct City Engineer to request Urban Thoroughfare designation on Center Blvd. Motion passed on following vote:

M/S Councilman Anderson-Reed, City Council request professional planning advice on the Bridge-Center improvement, and on the effects and future potential widening of Drake and/or Center Blvd., with particular reference to effects on land use; and that, after a preliminary field survey, the Council be prepared to budget planning funds. Passed unanimously

M/S Councilman Anderson-Scott, City Council authorize redesigning of Creekside Parking lot eliminating two levels. Passed unanimously

M/S Councilman Reed-Anderson to apply for Federal Aid Secondary routing on Center Blvd., and in same motion don't want four lanes beyond the bridge or beyond a reasonable funnel from the bridge until such time as we have answers relative to by-pass and have answers to transit solutions and we have our general plan put in Federal Air Secondary system so we can build the bridge. Motion passed on following vote:

M/S Councilman Reed-Scott, incorporate Ross-Barber modifying signals with Phase 2 (Proj. 65). Motion passed on following vote:
