GOLDEN GATE BRIDGE BOARD HEARING ON TRANSIT

Statement for presentation at Golden Gate Bridge Board hearing on transit, 2/11/69 read and introduced by Councilman Anderson.

M/S Councilman Anderson-Reed to adopt statement, send to other Marin Cities for similar action before 2/11/69, with copies to Board of Supervisors, Marin Transit District and Golden Gate Bridge Board. Unanimously passed  
Mr. Anderson complimented for his efforts and appointed to represent City at hearing.

BAN ON BACKYARD BURNING:

Councilman Reed read and introduced three point statement on policy to be presented to Bay Area Air Pollution Control District at hearing on backyard burning 2/5/69.

M/S Councilman Reed-Anderson to adopt statement and have Councilman Reed and Administrator present it at hearing. Passed unanimously

MEMORIAL PARK IRRIGATION SYSTEM:

Upon recommendation of Administrator completion of irrigation system was further considered with possibility of utilizing General Fund reserves for this. Completion at one time should result in substantial savings over doing the work in two installments. M/S Councilman Scott-Reed to rescind motion made at Jan. 28th meeting, accept bid of Sibbald Construction for Items #1 and #2 in the amount of \$8862.00 plus \$750.00 for Marin Municipal Water District work and transfer needed additional funds from Park Dept. unappropriated reserve. Passed unanimously

M/S Councilman Scott-Reed accept bid of Sibbald Construction for total amount of \$13,437.00 for all found items plus \$750.00 for Marin Municipal Water District work and transfer need additional fund from General Fund Reserve. Passed unanimously

Mr. England announced that a hearing on the Z'berg Local Recreation Fund proposed legislation would be held in San Bruno in the near future. A commissioner was authorized to attend, if possible.

A letter from Marin County on the matter of a Senior Citizen Program for the coming fiscal year was referred for action by the Council at its next meeting.

M/S Councilman Scott-Reed Administrator was directed to send a letter to Dr. Hayakawa informing him the Council voted approval of his conduct in handling the affairs of S.F. State College and want it to remain open. Unanimously passed

M/S Capurro-Scott Parks & Recreation be authorized to place picnic tables at Robson-Harrington Park, giving sketch showing locations to council. Unan. Passed

Administrator reported on visit by Herb Roberts of HUD, inspecting proposed sites for tot lots, parks and Jones acreage. Was apparently favorably impressed by the latter and several of the others. Need for some indication to the Joneses as to the City's intentions was noted. M/S Councilman Anderson-Reed instruction Administrator to submit application to HUD for Jones acreage and express to the Joneses that the City approves acquisition in principle, subject to financial assistance from HUD. Unanimously passed. With reference to the other parcels Administrator to determine estimate cost of acquisition and report to City Council for further action.

Councilman Capurro expressed thoughts on budgeting for an additional fireman, to spend nights hours on call at Robson-Harrington Park with pick-up truck so he can respond to fires from there. This might obviate need for live-in caretaker and reduce costs, while improving fire protection.

Need for removing any salvageable shrubbery from Hub park while transplanting is seasonable also removal of fountain for a possible wadin pool at Memorial Park was discussed. Items not possible to move to left there until Hub rebuilt.

M/S Councilman Reed-Anderson instructing staff to expedite plans for Creekside Parking lot and move fountain and shrubbery as effort to salvage these as soon as practicable. Unanimously passed.

Councilman Reed reported on proposed elementary school needs. Council might favor school adjacent to Sorich Park with some joint use of Park as now exists with Isabel Cook School and Memorial Park but does not wish to relinquish any of flat area for school buildings. Matter tabled until school district has more definite plans.

Letter from Vinodkumar Bhagodia offering display of pictures referred to Councilman Anderson to research authenticity with Indian Consulate and Dr. Singh and report back.

Letter from Mrs. Bordner on proposal for a swimming pool and tennis complex was referred to Parks & Recreation Commission for assistance as they might give her.
