BICYCLE PATHS

City Administrator read resolution<sup>#1278</sup> on Marin County proposal for bicycle paths. Memo's from Parks & Recreation Commission and Planning Assistant recommending approval. CORRECTED PAGE 317

M/S Councilman Reed-Ragan to adopt resolution as read, city designate same as its official bike route: up Shady Lane, turn left at Bolinas, right at Kensington left at Ross, right at Sunnyside, left at Crescent, left on Raymond, left on Tamalpais to San Rafael Ave., over Grove Lane and up San Anselmo Ave. left at Lansdale Ave. to Fairfax. Signs to be placed as designated by County Parks & Recreation. Passed unanimously

PETITION TO REPAVE JORDAN AVENUE

Petition signed by residents regarding condition of Jordan Ave., read, also memo from City Engineer suggesting these people express their views at budget time. Lawrence Wilsey representing group spoke to council, also Mr. Braddock of Jordan Avenue. Mayor Capurro stated budget sessions is proper time to bring this before council, feelings of council nothing can be done at this time, but residents should approach Engineer in March when preparations for budget is being made.

APPEAL

Adolph Meyer, 56 Lincoln Ave. appealing the denial by Planning Commission to subdivide his property. Mrs. Porteous present representing Mr. Meyer addressed council asking they give consideration to appeal.

Feeling of majority of council no hardship shown. Mayor Capurro feels a house could be built on this lot that would be an asset to city, M/S Councilman Reed-Ragan that SS154, subdivision of lot A/P 6-241-47 & 48, city council uphold the decision of Planning Commission and deny appeal. Motion passed on following vote:

TRAFFIC FLOW, SIR FRANCIS DRAKE-ARBOR ROAD

Don Berry, representing Mr. Delano, Jack-in-the-Box stated they will be more than happy to cooperate, will endeavor to encourage customers to use rear exit and would be happy to sit down with City Engineer to discuss same. City Engineer suggests "no left turn exit at rear". No further action taken.

FREE STANDING SIGN, 640 Sir Francis Drake

M/S Councilman Ragan-Reed to approve sign as presented with stipulation that present sign facing west be removed. Unanimously passed

ABAG:

Transportation program financings: Councilman Reed read his memo on same. M/S Councilman Ragan-Anderson that City Council concur with memorandum as read and direct Councilman Reed to cast vote of approval. Passed unanimously

Recommended Bylaws amendment: memorandum from Councilman Reed recommending changes. M/S Councilman Ragan-Anderson to approve Oct. 23rd memo by Councilman Reed on amendments to bylaws and endorse his desire in sending same to call cities. Passed unanimously

SENIOR CITIZENS PROGRAM

Memo from Frank Quinn stating commission recommends the appointment of David Long for the Supervisor's position of Senior Citizen Group, 30 hours monthly at \$5.00 per hour. (\$150.00) per month).

M/S Councilman Ragan-Reed, city council approve above recommendation. Passed unanimously Matter of naming of tot lot "small peoples Park", no action by council. Area to be Memorial Park Tot lot.

M/S Councilman Ragan-Anderson approval to minute resolution accepting the improvements on Arbor Road for maintenance, but not to include trees and plants Passed unanimously

MODIFICATION OF SIGNAL, HEADS, DRAKE & ROSS

Memo from City Engineer recommending controller modification. M/S Councilman Reed-Ragan to approve changes, authorize City Engineer to hire Traffic Signal Co., to do work and transfer \$400.00 from General fund to 446-20. Passed unanimously

CLAIM

Fred DeCook claim against city for distruction of house at 21 Loma Robles. City Council referred same to City Attorney.

DESTRUCTION OF SEALED FINANCIAL REPORT

M/S Councilman Ragan-Capurro that sealed financial survey and 1961 Grand Jury Report be destroyed as recommended by City Administrator. Passed unanimously

ORDINANCE NO. \_\_\_\_\_ An ordinance amending Title 6, Chapter 1, of the San Anselmo Municipal Code (Business Licenses) by providing for the imposition of the license fee to be based upon gross receipts of certain businesses. Read by Title, first reading.

Don Minto, Shall Service Station and Abe Froman spoke to council opposing setting business license by gross receipts.

ORDINANCE NO. 588 An ordinance amending Title 3, Chapter 5 of the San Anselmo Municipal Code by providing for the towing away of unlawfully parked or stopped motor vehicles in certain restricted zones.

M/S Councilman Ragan-Reed approval and adoption of same as an emergency ordinance. Passed unanimously

CITY ADMINISTRATOR REPORTED ON THE FOLLOWING:

Met. With Mr. Terry, Mr. Allison, Chief of Police, City Engineer on matter of pickup of students at Drake High School and arranged that pickup will be from Drake parking lot instead of an Saunders Avenue. No further action.

Reported received check in the amount of \$26,384.72 from Sleepy Hollow Fire Protection District, \$5,000.00 covering San Domenico School was not received.

Asked City Council's approval to miscellaneous employees' exchanging November 11 holiday for Friday after Thanksgiving. Council approved same.

ROBSON-HARRINGTON

City Administrator reported he had inspected greenhouse with staff members and they were concerned about condition of same, glass broken, construction in bad condition and had instructed Frank Quinn to remove same.

Councilman Reed stated City Council should be instructed when something of this nature comes up, stated he is also dissatisfied with maintenance of Robson-Harrington property. Councilman Ragan felt maybe council should have a field trip to property. M/S Councilman Anderson-Reed that City Administrator instruct Parks & Recreation to submit a monthly report, showing names, hours, days people work at Robson-Harrington. Unanimously passed. Councilman Reed asked that staff be instructed not to destroy any city property without council approval.

City Engineer reported on leaking roof at R-H, have bid from McLaren Roofing (\$625.00) should replace wood gutters (\$500.00) more. Mayor Capurro feels wasting money should replace roof, get a price on re-roofing.

M/S Councilman Reed-Ragan, City Engineer get bids for doing necessary work. Unan. Passed M/S. Councilman Reed-Ragan to spend \$150.00 for bisqueen to cover leaks. Unan. Passed Councilman Reed stated creek committee need (1) more member, maybe councilman can make suggestion.
