CITIZENS ADVISORY COMMITTEE, HOUSING ELEMENT OF GENERAL PLAN

M/S Stewart, Reed that a Citizens' Committee be formed to prepare a Housing Element for the City of San Anselmo and the goals of this committee shall be:

1. To promote and insure the provision of adequate housing for all persons regardless of income, age, race or ethnic background.
2. To promote and insure the provision of housing selection by location, type, price and tenure.
3. To promote and insure open and free choice of housing for all. The Committee will also prepare separate statements on the subjects of open space, transportation, and other related public facilities in San Anselmo as they relate to the recommendations put forth in the Housing Element Guidelines of the State of California with separate statements on land use and density. Passed unanimously. The City Planning Staff, Legal Counsel and the Planning Commission will serve in an advisory capacity to the citizens committee which will be comprised of volunteers. It was also agreed that the name of the committee will be Citizens Advisory Committee, Housing Element of the General Plan and it will be an open committee as far as the number of people are concerned. Passed unanimously.
