OLD BUSINESS

a. STATUS REPORT ON THE BALANCED TRANSPORTATION PROGRAM

There was a lengthy discussion on "Marin in 1990" at the Council meeting of April 18th which was sent with Ms. Ellinwood's letter of March 15. Under date of April 21, 1972, Mrs. Anne West directed a detailed letter to the City Council regarding Highway 17 in the Balanced Transportation Program. After lengthy discussion, Mr. Kaepfel was asked by the City Council to re-write his letter of April 20th to Mr. Robert Harrison, Coordinator, Balanced Transportation Program, CCPC, to affirm that the City Council resists any major traffic thoroughfare through San Anselmo including Highway 17, that the findings of the report support the reason for the Council's concern, and that the Council is against it for the reasons they had previously given. c

MATTERS OF GENERAL PUBLIC INTEREST

b. AMENDMENT TO BAAPCD REGULATION 2 (Mr. Brand)

M/S Blinder, Anderson that the Council recognizes the abiding and direct concern that San Anselmo has with regards to the quality of the air in Marin County and we recognize a regional ordinance effecting the most strict possible controls as outlined in the first draft. Passed unanimously. c

c. GOLDEN GATE NATIONAL RECREATION AREA (Mr. Raab)

This item was placed on the agenda by Mr. Stewart who turned the discussion over to Mr. Raab, Marin County Chairman sponsoring the Golden Gate National Recreation area. He reported there are several groups who are working together to bring about another federal park for the Bay Area which would include property on both sides of the Golden Gate Bridge. M/S Stewart, Capurro that the Council endorses the concept of the proposal for a Golden Gate National Recreation Area as generally outlined in House of Representatives bill No. HR9498 (Representative Burton) and that this area be used in a manner which would preserve its unique natural character and that the specific planning of the use of this area be done by a Citizens Advisory Committee representing those people most affected in both the cities and the unincorporated areas of the county and that these people be appointed by the Board of Supervisors. The final plan for this recreation area should include a specific proposal that would provide access to this area by means of public transportation to the extent that the automobile be excluded from areas not at present developed. Passed unanimously. pkr

d. REPORT BY SANITARY DISTRICT ON CREEK OBSTRUCTION (Mr. Noah)

Mr. Noah of the Sanitary District showed on a map the intended improvements in San Anselmo for the next 1½ years. pw

M/S Anderson, Capurro to extend the period of time for remedying creek obstructions for one year. Ayes: Councilmen Anderson, Capurro, Blinder, Perry

Noes: Councilman Stewart

Mayor Perry stated that if someone can offer an interim solution for some relief, the city would want to consider it.

e. ELM BEETLE SPRAYING

Councilman Blinder reported on the imbalance of nature caused by spraying and suggested the use of biological control adding that effects would not be evident immediately - that it might take a year or two. He suggested trying not to spray for one year and see what happens since spraying is done on a scheduled basis and not necessarily for the need. pw
 M/S Blinder, Stewart that the Council finds it unnecessary on an experimental basis to spray the elm trees in San Anselmo this year. To evaluate the effects of this restraint should some form of control be deemed necessary the following year, that biological control be given first consideration. Passed unanimously.

f. ADMINISTRATIVE MATTERS

1. Civil Service Board of Review-No applications. The press was asked to make known the vacancies on boards in San Anselmo.
2. Liaison with County Human Rights Commission - No applications.
3. City's representatives to ABAG General Assembly. Former Councilman Reed was the representative and Mayor Perry the Alternate. No appointment made.

g. PERMISSION TO CALL FOR BIDS, HUB ISLAND LANDSCAPING

M/S Anderson, Stewart to authorize the Public Works Department to advertise for bids for the Hub-Sequoia Drive irrigation system. Passed unanimously.

h. SET PUBLIC HEARING ON AMENDMENTS TO TITLE 10, CHAPTER 3, MUNICIPAL CODE

(Planning & Zoning) Mr. Kaepfel read the minutes of March 28 regarding the ordinance amending certain sections of Title 10, Chapter 3 of the Municipal Code which showed there was no action taken. Public Hearing was set for May 23, 1972 and is to be placed early on the Agenda.

M/S Stewart, Anderson to appoint Mrs. Virginia Fogerty as Administrative Secretary effective May 1, 1972, Range 37, Step A, \$618.00 per month. Passed unanimously.
